The Nazi chief's recent atti-tude has been that of abandouing lus partner in crime as no longer. useful to the Axis cause. Hitler's change of mind, if not of heart, is easily understandable in view of the opening of the Russian drive. He has decided to impede the Allied operations in the Mediterranean as much as possible while he is engaged in Russia.

German and Italian airmen over the Fourth gave. American and British squadrons attacking Sicily the heaviest opposition since the height of the Tunisian campaign. Everywhere the Axis air defense stiffened strongly and the Nazis, as would be expected, were particularly active and apparently taking the lead in resisting the fierce Allied bombing.

It isn't yet clear how much air power Hitler has shifted to Italy or may be prepared to send there He has been conserving his luftwalle for emergencies. He not only has been considering the feasibility of inaugurating a final grand offensive against the Reds, but has had to figure on a probable Russian offensive if he himself didn't strike first. There also has been the threat of invasion of western Europe by the Anglo-American forces. However, he undoubtedly can


