# Science

## On the State Farm Front

(Telling the results of University of Wisconsin farm scientists, compiled from college of agriculture releases.)

Who called the hog a dumb animal? Science knows better. For example:

Pigs have a knack for balancing their own feed rations. They know just how much feed they need. They use proteins wisely and economically.

That may not be intelligence, simply instinct. But anyway it's a break for the farmer who is using a self-feeder with his hogs. He can fill the feeder at intervals, putting protein feeds in a separate section, and rest assured that the feed will be used fully as economically as if he measured it out pound by pound.

As for over-eating—well, there just isn't much danger. If the self-feeder gives hogs full access to all they want, they eat what they need and then stop.

Swine self-feeders are included on the list of "priority" farm building projects.

Another popular building project this year, again with good scientific reason, is the farm milkhouse. Dairymen feel that high quality milk can't be produced without the right milk house arrangement, and Wisconsin farm construction men predict a milk-house boom this season.

Already between 50,000 and 60,000 are in use in the state.

Farmers are looking beyond war conditions, and are considering future market requirements as they build, engineers say. The prospects for future barn remodeling or building also affects milk house location.

Concrete blocks have proved to be high in insulating value, and engineers expect wide use of this light-weight masonry in milk houses.

Just because the hill is steep, don't give it up as pasture. Pasture scientists at the University of Wisconsin and the Lake States Forest Experiment station find that

steepness alone is not an insurmountable drawback.

Of course other things may stand in the way. The soil may not be deep enough, or sufficiently water-holding, to produce a good crop when fertilized. It may not be possible to furnish grazing and still keep a cover against soil loss.

But if these things can be worked out, and if the slope is not too steep for machinery to operate there, it can supply as good a pasture as you'll see anywhere, the tests showed.

Slopes of as much as 26 to 35 per cent averaged 3000 pounds of dry feed to the acre last year.

A potato blight epidemic may again be in the making, plant disease specialists are warning.

Last year's blight attacks left their mark on the potato seed. Cool and moist weather this summer would give it a chance to show up. Already several outbreaks have been reported in places where infected seed was planted.

Spraying or dusting with a copper preparation is necessary for control. Most large growers have suitable equipment. Custom treatment, spray or dusting rings, or application of commercial dusts
