SNEEZE OR NOT TO SNEEZE; OPA RULING SOUGHT

TOLEDO, O., July 7 — (INS) — The Toledo OPA office, unable to decide whether or not to issue extra gas ration coupons to hay fever sufferers so they might travel north to escape the ragweed plague, today sent the problem to Washington.

Examples of how the additional reduction will operate for various representative tonnage groups on a sliding scale basis:

- Users of 25 tons per quarter, no reduction; 50 tons, 2.5 per cent; 75 tons, 3.75 per cent; 100 tons, 5 per cent; 200 tons, 4.75 per cent; 300 tons, 4.50 per cent; 400 tons, 4.25 per cent; 500 tons or more, 5 per cent.
