The additional five per cent reduction does not apply to the first 25 tons for newspapers using less than 500 tons a quarter. This provision, WPB said, is designed to 5 30-Just Plain Bill, Dramatic-nbe aid the operation of smaller news-

Last December 31 newspapers were limited each quarter to 100 of the tonnage of paper used in printing their net paid circulation during the corresponding quarter of 1941, plus a three per cent allowance for production waste. It was estimated at the time this requirement meant an overall reduction in current newsprin consumption of about 10 per cent.

H. M. Bitner, director of the WPR printing and publishing division, said however the 10 per cent reduction was not accomplished.
