If no bad effects are observed he would then be justified in feeding it to the entire herd. Possibly it can be used when diluted with other grain such as corn. Scabbed grain may cause nausea or vomiting in which case feeding of it should be discontinued. No cases of animals dying as a result of eating scabby grain have ever been reported. Whether low yielding fields of scabby wheat should be pastured or harrested can only be determined by that can be screened from the khriveled grain is suitable for All varieties of wheat are susceptible to scab, altho they may differ in severity of damage done.

It is suggested that random samples taken at different times during threshing or from at least a dozen different places in the bin. Finally, if sold by the Doyle log rule, the scale is less than the actual volume of the logs. For example, a 12 foot log, 12 inches in diameter scales 48 board feet by the Doyle scale, while it would actually saw out about 70 board feet mill scale
