Jan Struther Will Guestar on Information Please Tonight

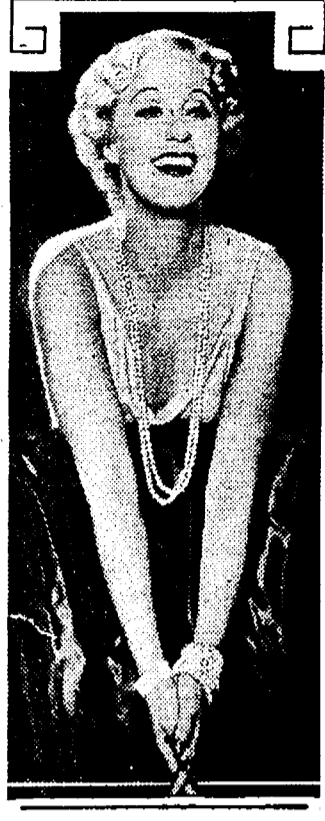

Uncle Ray's Corner

HUMMINGBIRDS are natives of the New World. Now and then people in India and Africa speak of certain birds as "hummingbirds," but they are not true members of the family, being properly classed as "sunbirds."

About 600 kinds of hummingbirds are known. Most of them are found in South America, but there are many in Central America and Mexico.

Several kinds make their nests in the United States and Canada. They are migrating birds which fly north in spring and return to southern parts for the winter. Some of them fly across the Gulf of Mexico, making above-water flights of from 700 to 900 miles. That is quite a distance for small birds to fly.

The smallest birds in the world belong to the hummingbird family. They live in Cuba, Jamaica and other islands of the West Indies. Some kinds of hummingbirds weigh less than half an ounce.

Ruby-throated hummingbirds are the kind found on the eastern side of North America, north of Florida. Many of these birds make their nests in Ontario and Quebec.

What a dainty nest the ruby-throat builds! The framework is made of strands of bark and grass, often covered with moss. The inside is lined with down taken from plants or with "fluff" from cattail reeds.

The little nest usually is hung from a high tree branch. In this cradle the baby birds are gently rocked as the trees sway in the wind. It is hard to locate a hummingbird nest, since it is so small and matches the color of a tree.

Most hummingbirds attach their nests to tree limbs, but a few kinds prefer cliffs. They fasten their nests to the face of a cliff, or perhaps to an overhanging rock ledge.

The colors of hummingbirds have helped to make them famous. Their feathers may be deep green, yellow-green, red, blue, purple, white or black. Certain members of the family have been called "pieces of the rainbow."

One hummingbird, found in Peru, has a blue crown, a golden green back and a violet black tail, along with lower feathers which are red, white and green. This bird is found in Peru.
