An orchestra singer, a former ukulele strummer and a star who threatens to outshine his brother, head the cast of the new State film, "The Falcon Strikes Back." In order, the performers are Harriett Hilliard, Cliff Edwards and Tom Conway, brother of George Sanders, who forsook the heroic roles for heavier characterizations. Robert Preston and Ellen Drew appear in the co-feature, "Night Plane From Chungking." Showing for the last times Wednesday are "Slightly Dangerous" and "Sherlock Holmes in Washington."

Joe E. Brown and Judy Canova head the list of performers of the Quilna comedy, "Chatterbox," with Rosemary Lane and John Hubbard as the romantic supporting stars. John Wayne, Binnie Barnes and Albert Dekker appear in the co-feature, "In Old California," a daring adventure of more exciting days.

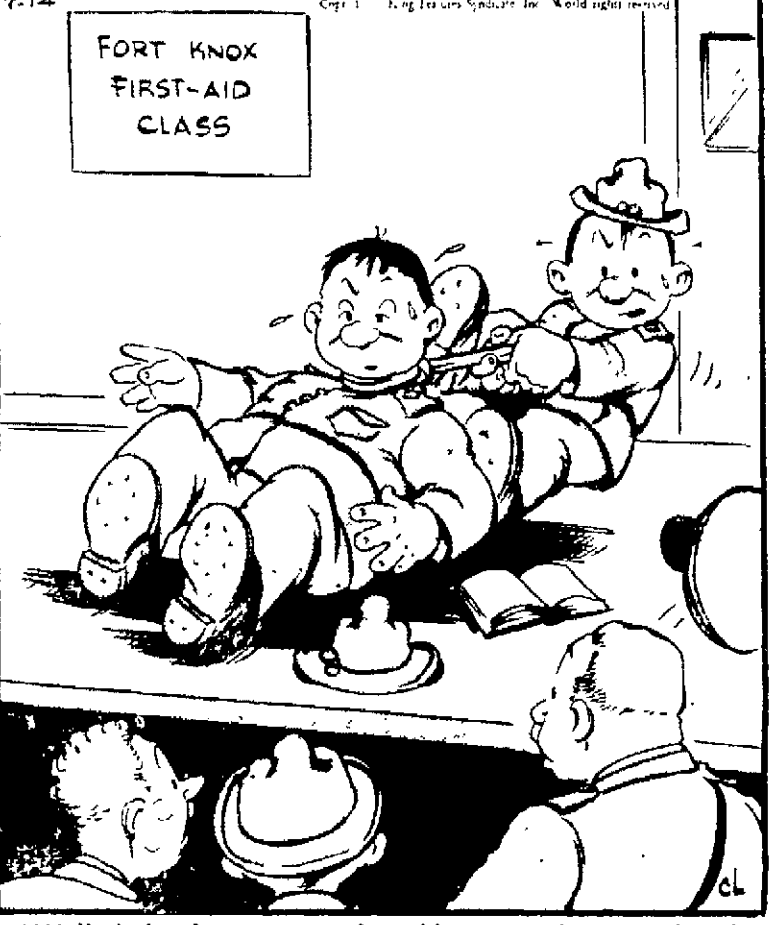

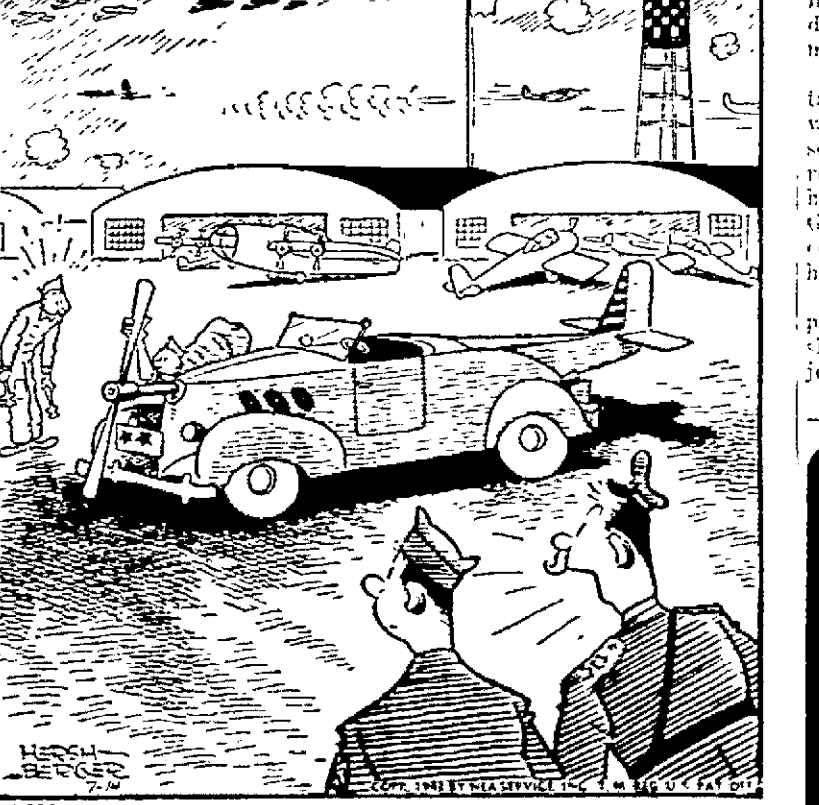
