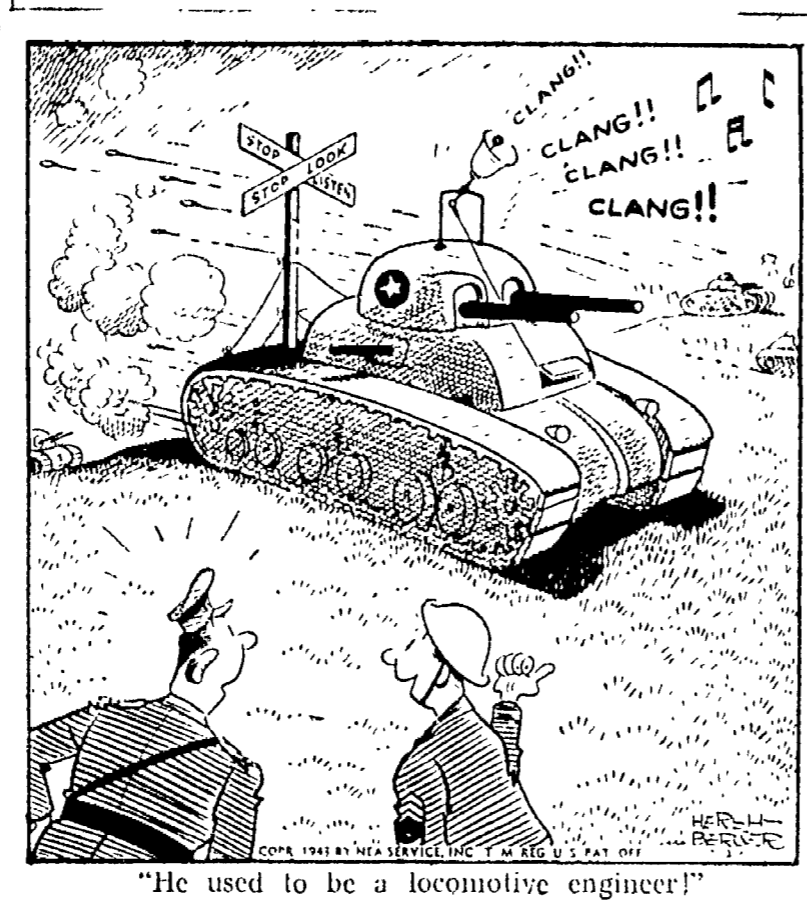

The familiar old bromide, "Always a bridesmaid but never a bride," can no longer be applied to Coney Island, New York's famed amusement resort.

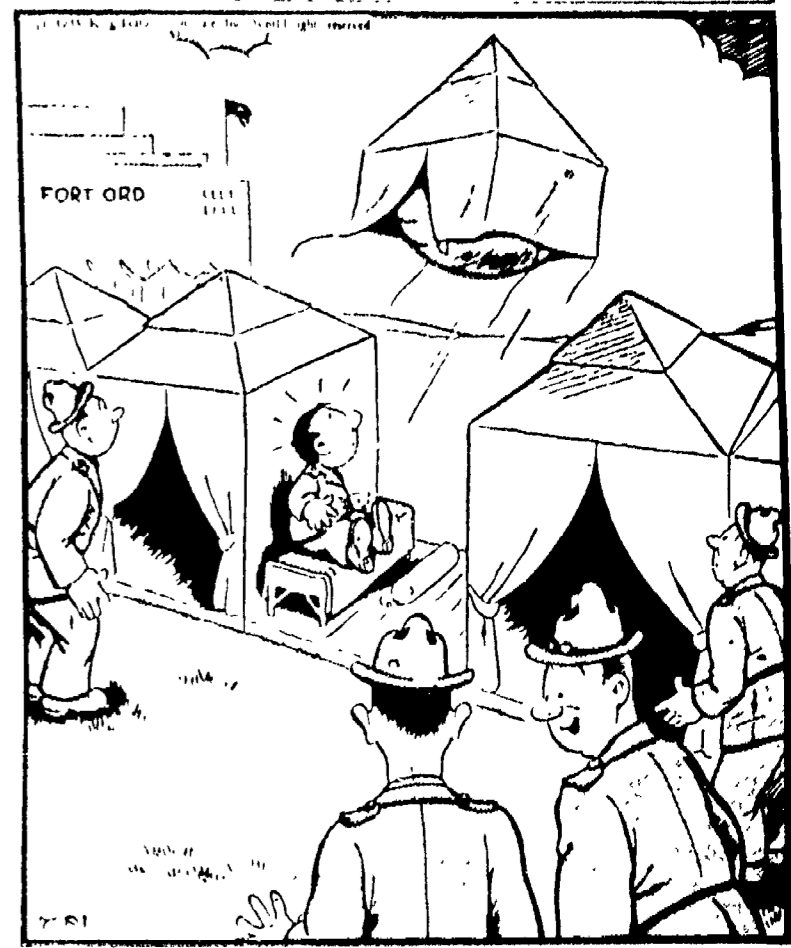
While the merriment of metropolitan fun lovers has provided the background for countless amusing film sequences, not until now has an entire production been devoted to the colorful and gay seashore resort.

## CONTRACTS FOR RUPERT DITCH ARE AWARDED

Contracts for the construction of the Ted E. Rupert Ditch in Spencer-tp have been awarded to three firms by the Board of Allen-tp commissioners, it was reported Tuesday.

The Hancock Brick and Tile Co. of Findlay was awarded the contract to furnish all material. The estimated cost of the material was \$3,127.20 and the firm's bid was the same.

The ditch is to be constructed in seven sections. The C. L. Bonnorri Co. of Sidney was awarded a contract to build three sections with the contract for the other four sections going to Frobase, Inc., of Lima.

The total cost of all material and labor for the improvement will be \$8,562.10. The amounts of the bids on the labor for each section follow:

Section 1 -- Bonnorri, \$380, estimate the same; section 2 -- Frobase, \$1,890, estimate the same; section 3 -- Bonnorri, \$1,051.28, estimate \$1,051; section 4 -- Frobase, \$405.50, estimate the same; section 5 -- Bonnorri, \$470, estimate the same; section 6 -- Frobase, \$380, estimate the same, and section 7 -- Frobase, \$868.12, estimate the same.

A petition has been received by the commissioners for the improvement of the Catherine E. Winget ditch in Perry-tp. The board will view that ditch Aug. 9 and hold the first hearing Aug. 11.
