RUSSIA'S KAZAKS MEET BITTER BLIZZARDS AND SANDSTORMS

live does not receive many smiles of Nature." It contains most of the Russian plains known as "steppes."

Bitter winds sweep the steppes in winter, and the average temperature in January is about zero Fahrenheit. Some January days are marked by a fall of temperature to more than 30 degrees below zero. When the winds strike thick-falling snow, there are heavy blizzards.

Most Kazaks live in the part of Russia known as "Kazakstan." In that land one of the worst blizzards in history came in 1827. In two days it took the lives of 1,012,000 sheep and 30,480 oxen, along with many camels and other livestock.

The summers in Kazakstan are fairly warm. The July average is about 75 degrees above zero. Yet the summers are far from pleasant. The winds are dry and carry little rain, an average of only one inch per month. Often the northeast winds bring sandstorms instead of rain!

We find cities in Kazakstan, a few of them having a population of more than 40,000. About three-fourths of the people, however, make their living by farming or by taking care of herds and flocks. Sheep are the most important livestock, and millions of them eat grass on the plains.

A large proportion of the Kazaks have settled homes, but there are thousands who lead wandering lives. They live in tents which can be moved from place to place. When grass is largely gone in one district, they take down their tents and carry them to another place, driving their livestock before them.

Lake Aral is in the land of the Kazaks. This lake (also called "Aral sea") has slightly salty water, but is less salty than the Caspian sea.
