Realizing that he might be compelled to reveal important medical secrets if captured, the doctor, identified in the story only as "Dr. Jack," chose to go down with the ship.

Fire Chiefs Asked to Aid Plant Protection

MILWAUKEE — (UP) — John Cudahy, state director of civilian defense, called upon the 400 Wisconsin fire chiefs opening their three day convention here Monday to cooperate with the council's plant protection program.

Cudahy said 20 plant protection officers have been appointed to train special civilian defense fire brigades. He said instruction is similar to that given professional firemen with emphasis on operation of fire extinguishers, handling of water lines, and methods of raising and lowering ladders.

U. S. Fund Will Aid Flood-Damaged Farms

WASHINGTON — (UP) — Secretary of Agriculture Claude R. Wickard announced Monday that a \$15,000,000 special fund authorized by congress in the second deficiency act is now available for loans to farmers whose farms have been damaged by floods.

The idea is to get the farms back into production as quickly as possible. Two types of loans are available. One, a long term loan repayable up to 20 years at 3 1/2 per cent interest, is for clearing debris and making major repairs to property. The other, a shorter term loan at 5 per cent, is for purchase of livestock, seeds, fertilizer, and repairs to machinery.
