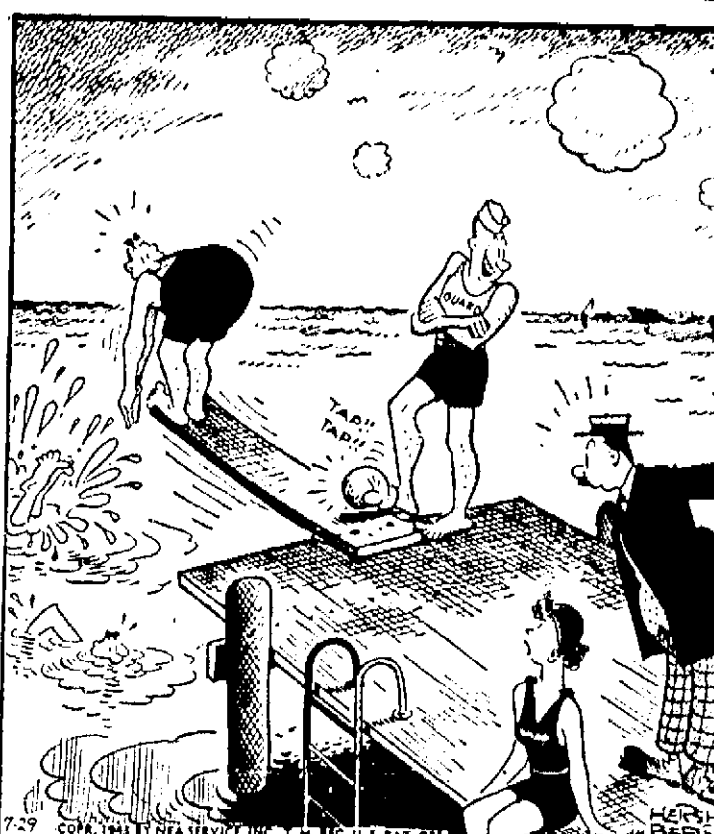

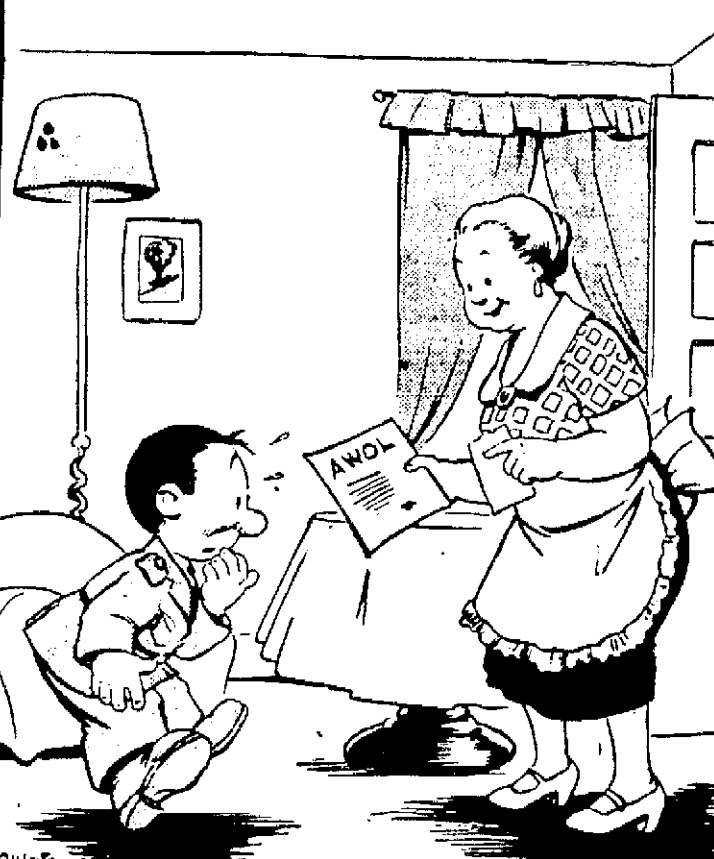

# FIRM CANCELS INSURANCE ON OHIO'S LIQUOR

COLUMBUS, July 29.—(UP)—Theft of liquor from state stores has become so costly that the liquor department's burglary insurance has been cancelled and the department may have to insure its own losses. Liquor Director Don A. Fisher said today.

Fisher said the Indemnity Insurance Co. of North America cancelled its three-year contract recently when insurance losses totaled \$24,000 for the year ending in June while premium payments were only \$8,000 for the year.

He said he was contacting insurance companies to get bids on a new policy, but that if the premiums ran too high it might be necessary to set aside part of the department's rotating fund to cover its own losses.

Due Thursday at the Majestic are "Little Joe the Wrangler" and "Moonlight in Havana."

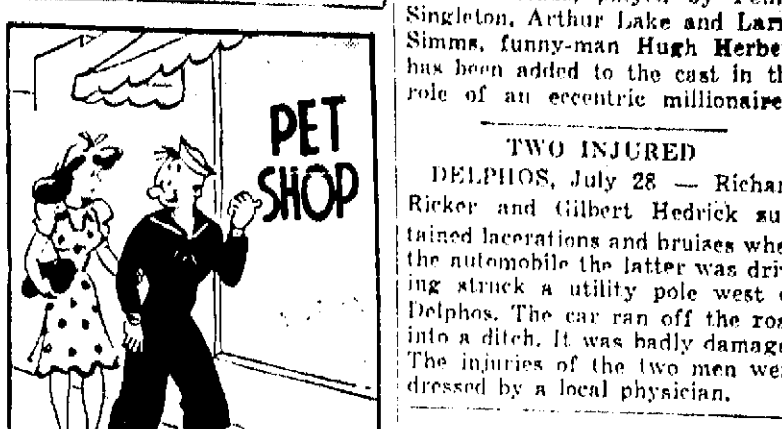

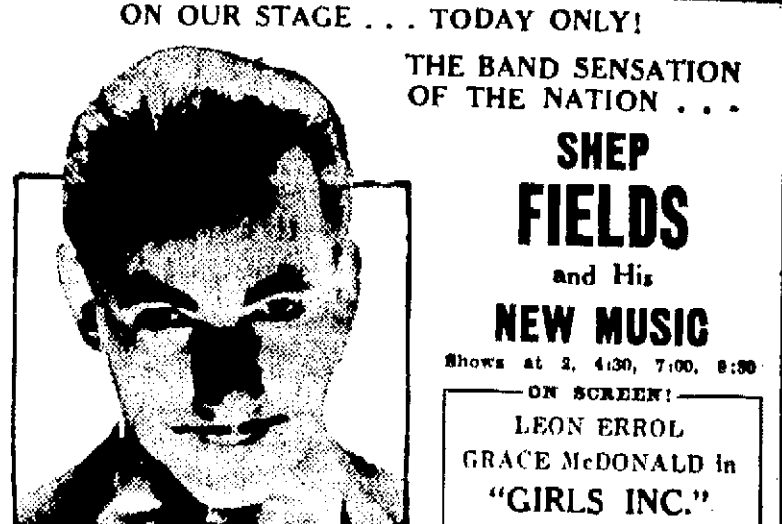

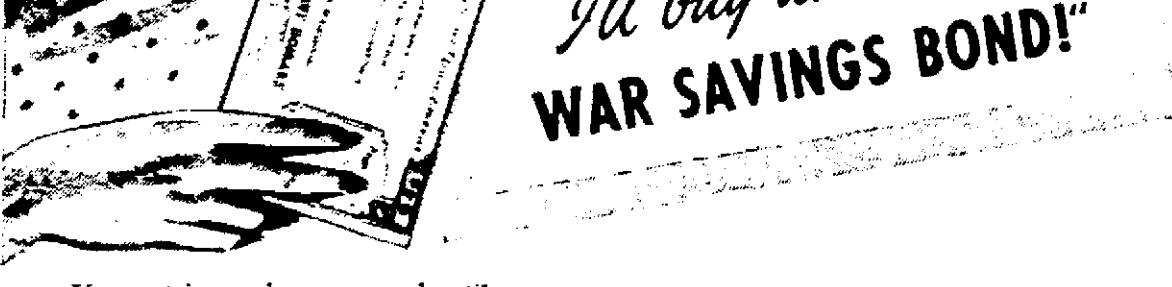
