

SCHOOLS OPEN AT DELPHOS ON SEPTEMBER 7

Calendar For Entire Year Is Announced By Men In Charge

(Lima News Bureau) DELPHOS, July 31—Terms of the 1943-44 school year for both the public and parochial systems in this city have been arranged by Rev. Carl F. Reineck, head of St. John's high and grade schools, and Robert Christy, superintendent of public schools.

The two officials worked out the year's schedule and arranged the terms' closing and opening for the same dates, and with students of both systems observing the same holidays.

The same buses transport children to and from the parochial and public school buildings, so that it is advantageous for all classes to open and close simultaneously and to be in session the same times throughout the year.
