Viereck Sentenced to 1 to 5 Years

WASHINGTON—(U.P.)—George Sylvester Viereck, convicted of failing to disclose fully his German connections when he registered as a foreign agent, was sentenced Saturday to serve one to five years in prison. The publicist previously had been convicted and sentenced to serve 2 to 10 years. This conviction was overturned by the supreme court. Viereck, however, had served a year under the first sentence and this was taken into account by Justice Bolitha Laws in fixing the lighter sentence.
