# Uncle Ray's Corner

OLD-TIME fishermen often spoke of "big spouts of water" coming from the heads of whales. When they told such stories, they were speaking of what they thought they saw, not of what they really saw.


Closer study of whales has proved that the "spout" of a whale is made up of moist air, not of water. If you blow air from your mouth on a cold day, you will produce what looks like steam or smoke. The warm air from your lungs strikes the cold air outside, and this makes tiny bits of moisture condense and form "steam."

In the same way the whale blows air from its huge lungs, forming a misty mass which, from a distance, looks like a spout of water.
