SYNTHETIC MEAT BEING MADE IN U. S. BREWERY

ST. LOUIS, Aug. 7.—(INS)—Synthetic meat, made from yeast, water, molasses and costing about one-fifth the price of natural beefsteak, is in production at Anheuser-Busch, Inc., in St. Louis, it was learned today.

The product, it was said, will fool all but the most critical palates. Developed by Dr. Carl C. Lindgren of Washington university, the process works this way:

One hundred and twenty-five pounds of yeast is planted in a 1,000 cubic foot vat containing 7,000 gallons of water, a ton and a half of molasses to feed the yeast and ammonia to convert the yeast into protein. Then, 1,000 cubic feet of air a minute is stirred into the mixture and 12 hours later the "meat" is ready—a full ton of it.

Thousands of pounds of the "meat" already have been purchased by the Army and Navy and lead-agencies. The "meat" is only one of a number of new products of research being turned out at Anheuser-Busch—a brewing company—and test meals complete with two kinds of soup, meat loaf, muffins, cheese sticks and pie have been served in demonstrations, at the plant—all the courses made from yeast.

TOMMY TUCKER ORCHESTRA TO PLAY ON OHIO STAGE MONDAY

Tommy Tucker, who brings his famous orchestra to the Ohio Stage on Monday for a session of top-notch musical entertainment, is now known to fans the country over as the man who "Set The World On Fire"—despite his musical pleas to the contrary.

Tucker's recording of the hit tune "I Don't Want to Set The World On Fire" succeeded in doing exactly that—with more than 600,000 copies sold in the period of a few months, and many more still being sold.

Tucker was not the first, nor the only one to record this popular song—but it was he who popularized it so thoroughly, and it will always be identified primarily with him.

Here's the way it all came about. One night off, during an engagement at the Berkeley-Carroll hotel in Anshbury Park, N. J., Tucker drove into Philadelphia and visited a night club called Lew's Tavern—a musicians' haunt. There he heard Bon Bon, a Negro entertainer formerly featured with the Jan Savitt band, sing a number with a particularly haunting melody. Inquiry revealed that it had been published some time before the that the Harlem Leonard band had recorded it a year previously.

Tommy obtained an orchestration, began playing it and put it on wax at his very next Okeh recording session, with lovely Amy Arnell doing the local. It proved a musical bombshell, and it increased the already extensive popularity of the Tommy Tucker orchestra about one hundred-fold.

"Mr. Lucky" is on the screen this Saturday with Cary Grant in the leading role.

OHIO LEADS IN INDUSTRIAL PLANT PROJECTS

CLEVELAND, Aug. 7.—(INS)—The federal government has poured \$1,168,129,000 into industrial facility projects in Ohio as a part of the war program, the regional War Production Board revealed today.

In this category, Ohio leads the nation, WPA officials pointed out. Following the Buckeye state in valuation of plant installations and expansions are Illinois with \$1,141,860,000, and Pennsylvania with \$1,135,918,000.
