Abe, a former cabbie himself, spent a long ride telling the driver how to go about whipping a band into shape: he gave the man the full benefit of his own successful experience The driver listened well and acted soon-be was Paul Whiteman.

Abe Lyman began his own career in movieland's favorite Cocoanut Grove. One of his earliest filmland friends was a dark, bandsome foreign youth, seeking a movie break. Abe advised his he didn't think that his movie chances were too good. The actor was about ready to take Abe's advice when he received an invitation to a swank party where he could meet some of Hollywood's most influential people. Abe advanced him \$20 so he could appear groomed properly. At the party, the young actor won his first opportunity on the screen and he did fairly well from that point on. 


