A timely story of wartime America, with counterfeiting as the basis of a situation which finally attracts the attention of the F. B. I., is "I Escaped From the Gestapo," now at the Sigma. Dean Jagger, John Carradine and Mary Brian play the featured roles in this exciting film expose. "Union Pacific," with Barbara Stanwyck and Joel McCrea, also is showing.

Dorothy Lamour is starred with Bing Crosby in the rousing technical musical, "Dixie," which opens Thursday at the Ohio. Possessing 12 hit tunes, this picture deals with minstrel men and their ladies. In the supporting cast are Billy DeWolfe, Lynne Overman, Eddie Foy, Jr., and Marjorie Reynolds. Wednesday will be the final day for the showing of "Hit the Ice." The opening for "Dixie" was advanced to Thursday so that it may run a full week before making way for "This Is the Army," which is booked for next Thursday.

Lovely Gene Tierney and Don Ameche share top featured billing in the saucy surprising romantic comedy, "Heaven Can Wait," due to start Friday night at the Quilna. Currently playing at the Quilna are "Selling Your Partner," with Lulu Belle and Scotty, and "Shantytown," a first class musical picture.

At the Lyric is "City Without Men," which is set in a prison town, to which come the wives and sweethearts of innocent men and guilty, murderers, thieves and embezzlers. Linda Darnell and Michael Duane have leading roles. Joe E. Brown and Judy Canova furnish plenty of laughs in the co-feature, "Chatterbox."

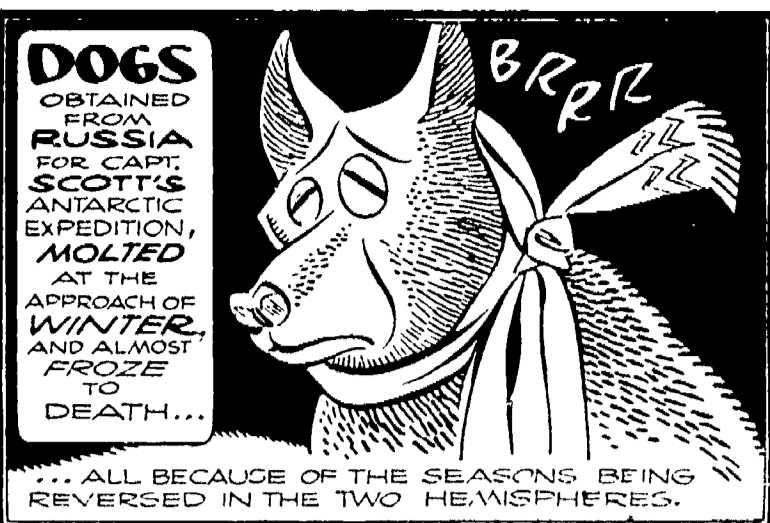

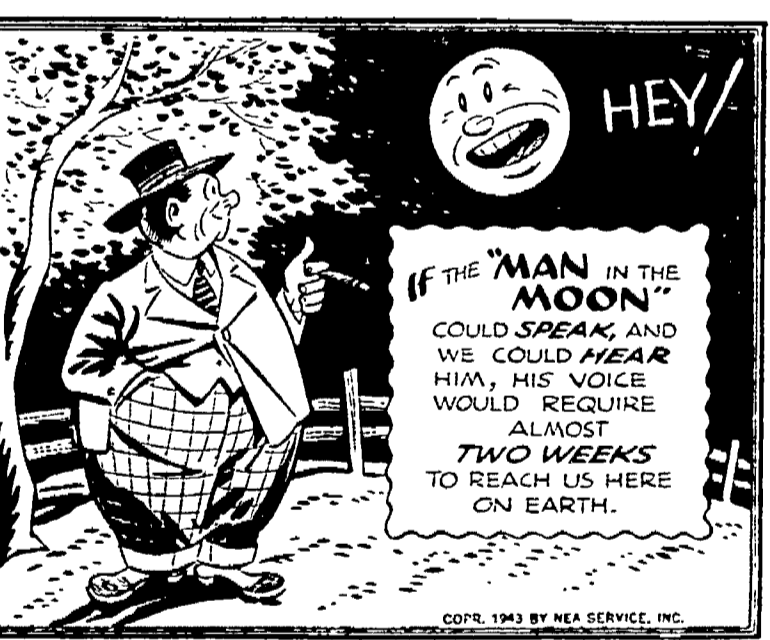
