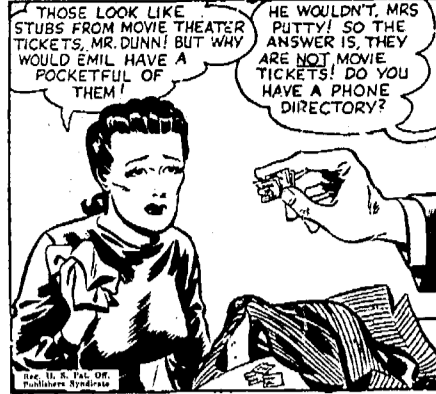

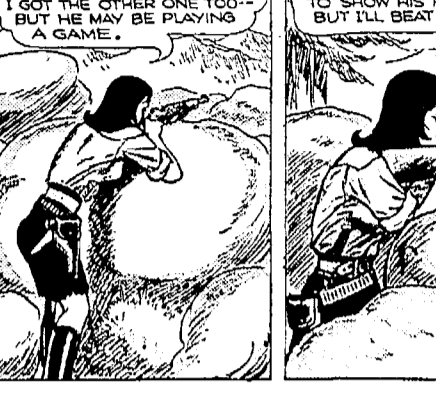

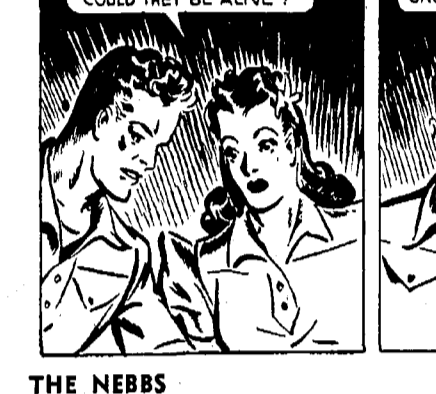

Unlucky GREEN TURTLES

Plates on Hawksbill Shell Overlap Like Shingles

When the shell of this sea-going turtle first came into use, however, it was called "tortoise shell," and that name has stayed with it.

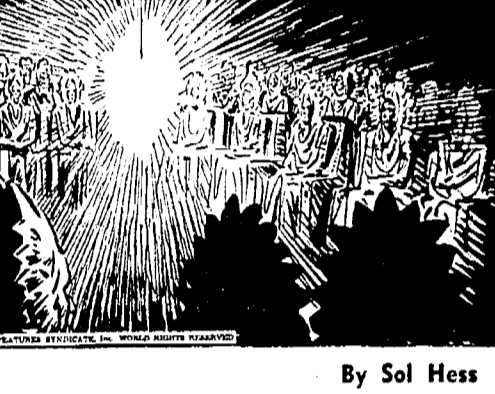
The hawksbill may have a shell two feet long. Its color is brown, mottled with yellow.

The plates which I have compared to shingles are, for the most part, about six inches wide and 12 inches long. They are only one-eighth of an inch thick.

When placed in boiling water, the hawksbill shell will soften, and the plates will come apart. While it is hot, a plate can be bent into almost any shape. It will keep the new shape after cooling.

Two or more plates can be welded together to provide thicker material with which to work. The welding may be brought about by pressing the plates with hot irons. Tortoise shell has been made

larger size than the hawksbill. Sometimes its shell is four feet long and the weight may be from 400 to 600 pounds.

Seaweed known as "turtle grass" make up the food of green turtles. They like the tender parts of this "grass" but let the rest go to waste. After the stems are cut, the parts of the turtle grass which are not eaten rise toward the surface of the sea. When turtle grass is seen floating about the ocean, it is a sign that these turtles are feeding down near the bottom.

People eat the flesh of green turtles, and also use it in making soup. The flesh of the very big ones is tough, and they seldom are placed on the market. Those which are sold usually weigh only from 40 to 80 pounds.
