30 PCT. SLASH IN NEWSPRINT SEEN POSSIBLE

MURRAY BAY, Que., Aug. 20 (UP)—A shortage of pulpwood amounting to 3,750,000 cords in the United States and Canada, which would force a 30 per cent cut in the amount of newsprint available for newspapers, books and magazines, was seen as a possibility today by members of a special house sub-committee investigating the newsprint supply.

Increased demand for paper in other fields because of the war was emphasized by Rep. Clarence J. Brown, R., O., a member of the committee.

"War has increased the demand for paper," he said, not only for direct purposes but to replace critical metals like steel and tin. The use of glass, another substitute, has made necessary greater amount of paper for packing."

MINSTER PRIEST IS PROMOTED

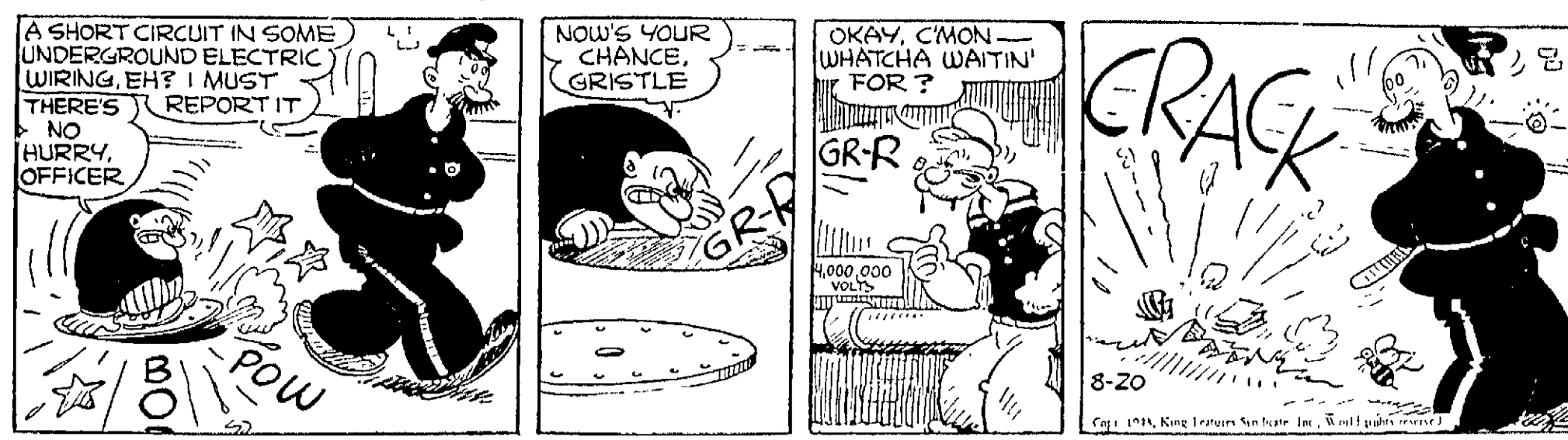
PENICILLIN AIDS BABY IN HER FIGHT FOR LIFE

CLEVELAND HAS SLIM LISTING OF CANDIDATES

(CLEVELAND, Aug. 20—(INS)—Cleveland's slimmest group of candidates for municipal offices in recent years was on record at the board of elections today as the deadline for declaration of candidacy passed.

Political experts were surprised when a third candidate for mayor declared himself. Heiman C. Schach, a candidate for county commissioner several years ago, filed petitions as a candidate for the Republican mayoralty nomination.

Edward C. Stanton, former Cuyahoga-co prosecuting attorney, has organization backing for the GOP nomination. No candidate

filed an opposition to Mayor Frank J. Lausche, Democrat incumbent.

Also ready for the race to the ballot on municipal primary day, Sept. 28, were a few more than 100 candidates for the 66 nominations for city council; about 10 candidates for municipal judge-ships and two candidates for the clerkship of municipal court.

CURFEW FOR 17-YEAR-OLDS GAINS FAVOR

MARYS, Aug. 20—Persons attending the hearing of the city council committee on the proposed curfew ordinance for St. Marys favored a curfew applying to all boys and girls under 18 years of age, it was reported. Judge Harry Wittenbrink of the juvenile court informed the council: n and others present that a majority of the delinquency cases brought into his court are those of youths between the ages of 17 and 18.

The council had given the first reading to an ordinance fixing the curfew for 10 p. m. for boys and girls under the ages of 17, unless accompanied by their parents or an approved adult.
