Uncle Ray's Corner

Wolverines Know How to Spoil Work of Trappers

WOLVERINES have been called "the most powerful animals in existence, pound for pound." Not only are they strong, but they are fierce as well. If brought to bay, they will put up a fight against much larger foes.

A full-grown wolverine weighs between 20 and 30 pounds. It is about three feet long, and two feet high at the shoulders. In general outline, it looks very much like a small bear, but it belongs to the weasel family.

Asia and Europe have wolverines. In England they are called "gluttons," and they are greedy animals. They eat large amounts of meat. One of them, in captivity, made away with 13 pounds of meat in one day—about half his own weight!

Forests in some northerly parts of the United States have wolverines, but there are far more of these animals in Canada. They are found far to the north, even up around the Arctic Circle.

Skins of wolverines can be sewed together and made into laprobes for use in sleighs. That has been done at times, but the big problem is where to get the skins! Wolverines know the art of keeping out of harm's way. It is hard, almost impossible, to catch them in traps. Like badgers, they stay in holes during the day and

Men working in Canada as trappers for the Hudson's Bay company have made many reports of wolverine trouble. They say that time and again a wolverine has followed a line of traps from end to end, setting off each trap but not getting caught!

When a wolverine finds an animal already caught in a trap, it is likely to eat the victim. In this way many martens and other valuable furry animals have been lost to trappers. All in all, the wolverine is not popular with men who make their living by gathering furs!
