Now that a new school year is about to start, it's appropriate to repeat what was said then about youngsters and adults who study music in public school or with private teachers:

There may be some who will ask, "What does it get them all this business of lessons and practicing and group rehearsals? Is it worth all the effort?"

The answer is simple; it's a forthright "Yes."

Now we'll stipulate (as the lawyers do) that few of the. hundreds of Madison youngsters who are taking lessons will develop into professional musicians. On the other hand, some will; there is always a scattering of boys and girls endowed with the natural musical talent, plus the desire and strength of resolution, necessary for success in music. Some will become teachers, others will get a chance at the spotlight of fame with voice or instrument. How about the others?

Well, you can bet that not one second of their time has been wasted. For no boy or girl or man or woman who comes in contact with music for any time can escape some imprint. He may not like his hours of scales, but he'll get something out of them. Probably he won't know it at the time, but he'll be learning the elements of musical appreciation. It's like learning anything else: one learns best by doing. And he learns, whether he wants to or not.

They won't know it now, nor admit it if they do, but those boys and girls of yours will thank you some day for being the kind of parents who put them in the path of music.

"Jews in American Wars" was written "not to impress our fellow Americans with the virtues of Jews, but because the facts of American history are the best answer to the libels which endanger the unity of our country." and those facts are all too little known.
