# Mrs. FDR Visits Yanks in New Zealand

WELLINGTON, N. Z. (U.P.) — Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt climaxed a day of intense activity Sunday night with a speech at a theater in which she expressed hope that statesmen who write the peace at the war's end will be conscious of the wishes of people the world over.  
"This time the voice of the people must be more articulate," Mrs. Roosevelt said.  
"I believe that the end of the war is in sight and victory is ours though it may yet cost many young lives and many women may weep."  
Earlier Mrs. Roosevelt toured American hospitals, visiting wards of wounded U. S. sailors and marines, and called at the Cecil club, American Red Cross servicemen's club in Wellington. Her trip to this area is a Red Cross representative.  
After attending services at a naval hospital outside Wellington, Mrs. Roosevelt addressed convalescents who crowded the halls.  
"I've come down here because the president wanted me to see on his behalf as many of the men in the fighting forces as possible," she said.
