Uncle Ray's Corner

Persons Struck by Lightning Sometimes Lose Their Shoes
SOME persons are afraid of lightning, but there is little use in being that way. If you happen to be in special danger, get out of the danger as well as you can. Then let Nature take its course.
Lightning moves so fast that if it kills a person, he doesn't hear the thunder. Of course such a person may hear thunder from other flashes before he is struck, but not the noise of the stroke which does the damage.
The reason for that is simple. Lightning moves more than 900,000 times as fast as sound!
Note that I speak only of those who die from lightning. In many cases a person has been struck but has come through with little harm. He may be slightly burned, but may hear the thunder clearly right after the lightning touches him.
When rain starts to fall while we are outdoors, it may seem natural to seek the shelter of a tree. If thunder is sounding, however, that is a dangerous thing to do. Scores of persons have been killed while
