STORY OF TOUGH MARINE AND OF SHIPYARD WORKERS BILLED

Wallace Beery Appears In Uniform At Sigma; Quilna Presents "Good Luck Mr. Yates"

Rough and lovable Wallace Beery is back again, this time appearing in "Salute to the Marines," the current Sigma attraction. Filmed in technicolor, this story of a tough marine also features Fay Bainter and Reginald Owen. "Henry Aldrich Swings It," a comedy, completes the program.

Airplanes fly over the Sarasota winterquarters of The Greatest Show on Earth all day long, and all the wild animals have become so used to them that they never look up—that is, all but Soudana, the famous giraffe, who carries her head so high she's air minded.

When planes fly during the road season over the tents of the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus, coming to Lima, Thursday, Sept. 16, Soudana tries to gaze at them thru the canvas. She would make an ideal interceptor command spotter if it were not for the fact she can't utter a sound. She has, like all giraffes, no vocal cords.

Soudana came in for Army mention, when the publication of the Third Interceptor Command, The Volunteer, ran her picture in its issue of January, 1943. Headed with the description, "Recruit," it read: "The Air Aircraft Warning Service could probably use Soudana, tallest giraffe at the Sarasota winterquarters of the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus, as an airplane spotter and an observation post, all in one. The long-necked native of Africa is equipped with two good sound detectors, is well camouflaged and has plenty of altitude."

Soudana took the story to heart, and she is an important part of the war effort, she thinks. She spots aircraft from Drew and MacDill Fields thruout the daylight hours. At night, she's up against it, as she is locked in the giraffe-barn, adjoining the corral.
