Farm Union Head Urges More Credit

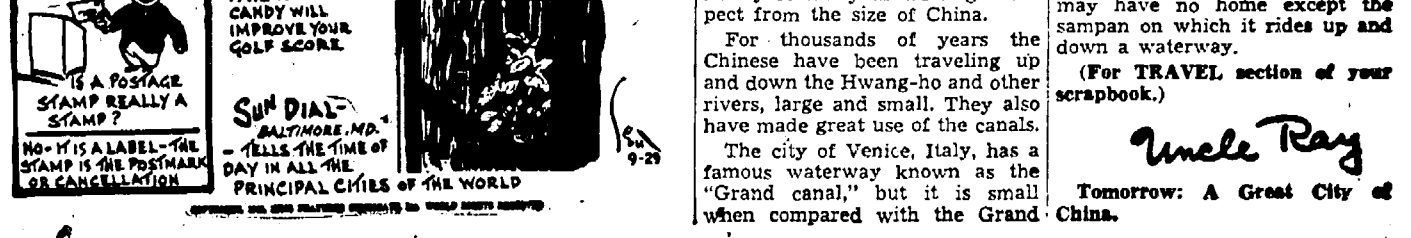
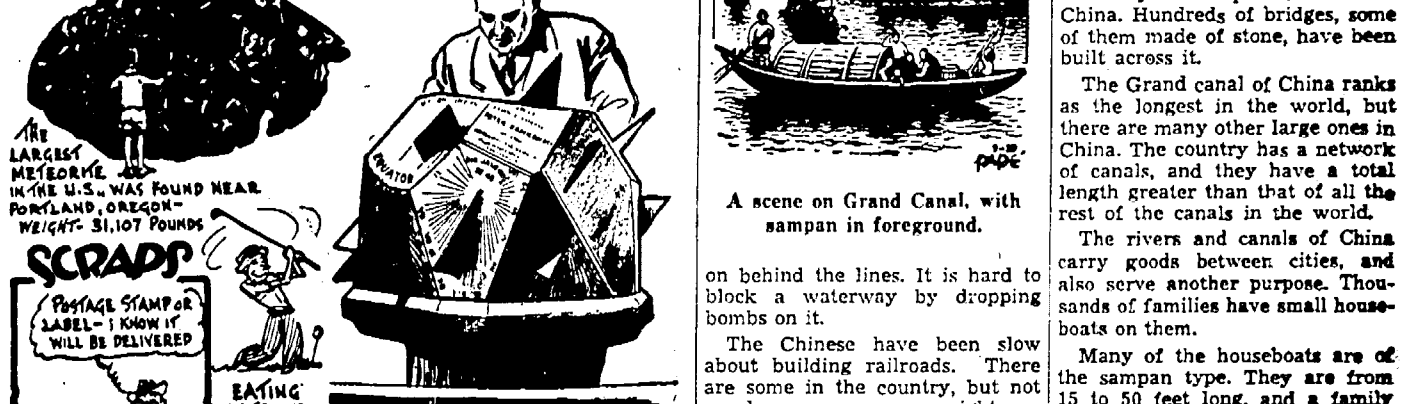
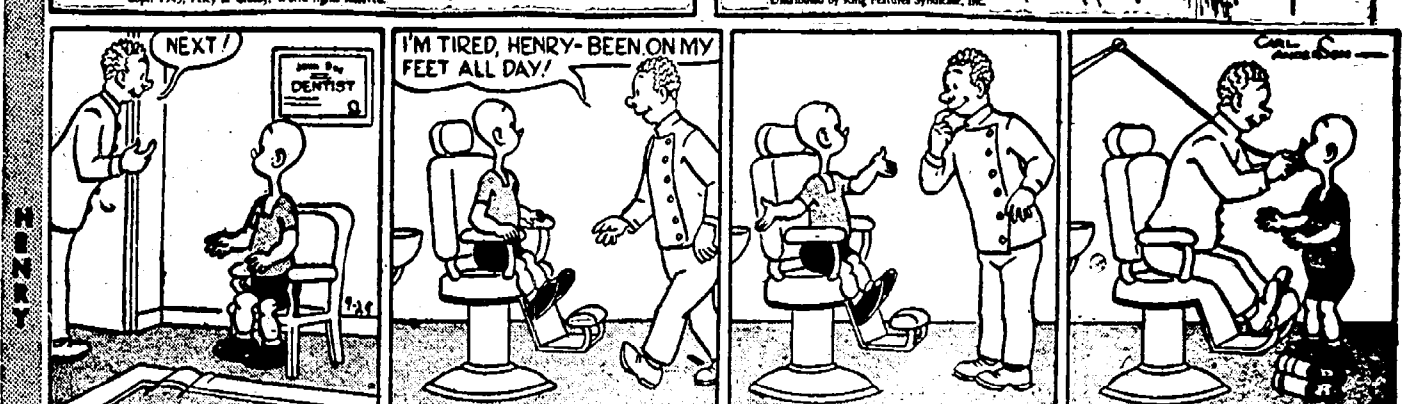
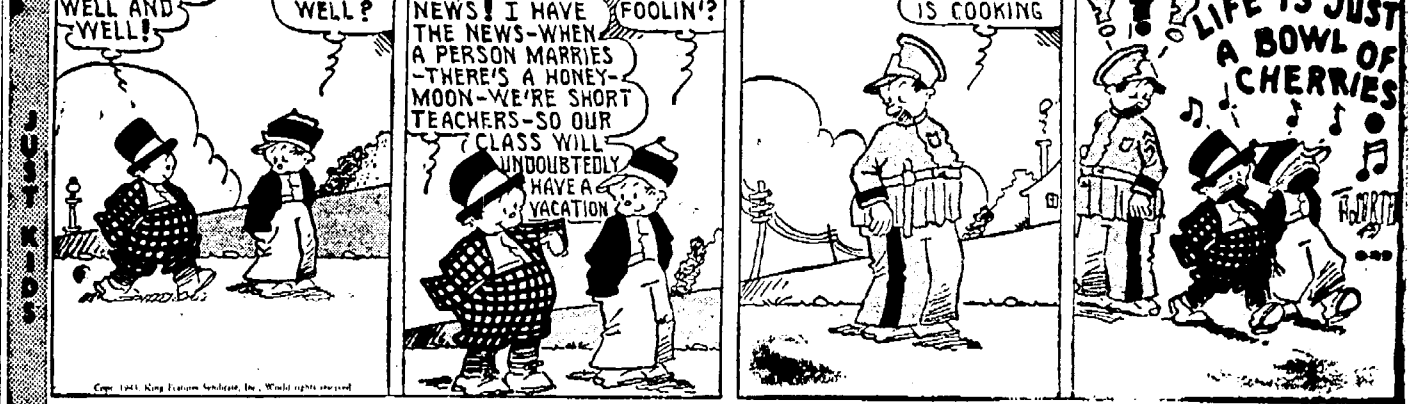
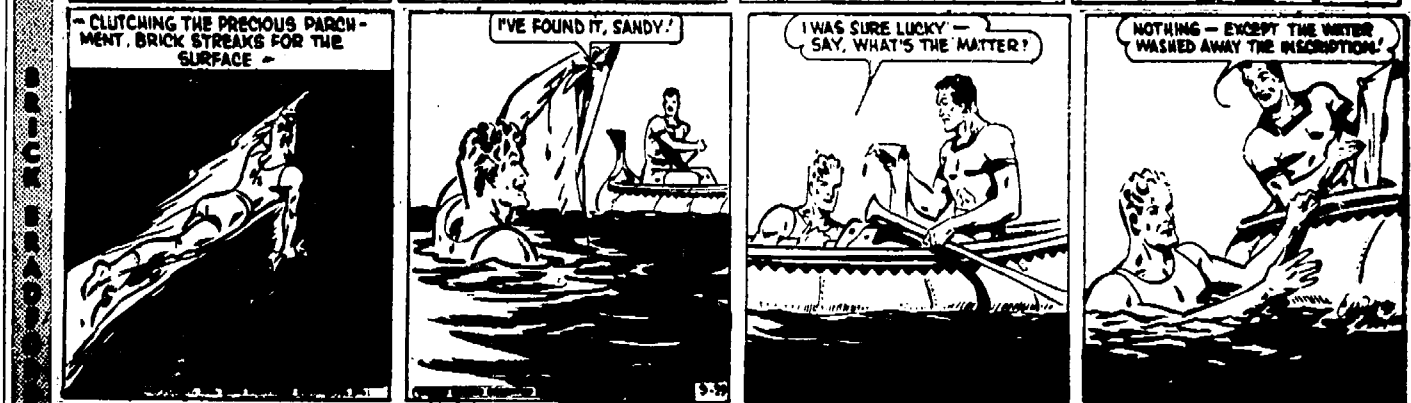
DENVER (U.P.)—James G. Patton, president of the National Farmers' union, said Tuesday that "agriculture should be treated by the government as industry has been treated."
"Uncle Sam should give farmers fat factories to operate in terms of hogs, and meat and milk factories in terms of cattle," Patton said in an interview.
"He should extend farmers a liberal line of credit for war production in which the government takes the risk of monetary loss arising from war food assignments."
Patton said that while more than \$17,000,000,000 has been appropriated for new industrial plants, congress would not consider a \$1,000,000,000 allotment to agriculture.

5 Million Fund to Aid FDR Urged for UAW

DETROIT (U.P.)—Establishment of a \$5,000,000 reserve fund by the United Automobile Workers (UAW) to aid in the reelection of Pres. Roosevelt for a fourth term was advocated today by Secretary-Treasurer George F. Addes in his yearly report to the membership.
Addes proposed that an assessment of 50 cents per month per member be applied for the duration of the war, to be divided equally between international and local unions, to meet "postwar emergencies" and to "take a more active part in the political field."
