

Sports Announcers Try For Answers On "Info, Please"

Two of radio's ace sportscasters, Bill Stern and Red Barber, join Franklin P. Adams and John Kieran in answering questions of Clifton Fadiman on "Information Please" Monday (WEAF 9:30 p. m. EST). The "Victory Parade of Spotlight Bands" will pay tribute to the crews of the famed PT boats on Monday when Tommy Dorsey and his orchestra will be heard over WJZ at 8:30 p. m., EST, from the Navy Receiving Barracks at Brooklyn, N. Y.

With a cast headed by Martha Scott and Dennis O'Keefe in their film roles, along with Mary Boland and Walter Abel, the "Screen Guild Players" offer a radio preview of the Andrew Stone farce comedy "Hi Diddle Diddle," on Monday at 9 p. m., over WABC. Advance reports indicate that the picture, which will be released thru United Artists, is a hilarious treatment of an unusual story.

On the eve of the World's Series, "Pride of the Yankees," the story of the late Lou Gehrig's rise from the sidewalks of New York to baseball's hall of fame, will be Cecil B.
