Egyptians used spoons of several kinds. Some of these have been found in tombs, and are now on display at museums. They were made of ivory, slate and wood, also of flint. Some of them were decorated with marks of the old Egyptian religion.

During the Middle Ages in Europe, the horns of cattle were cut off and used in making spoons. Wooden spoons also had a place in the kitchen and on the dinner table. Silver spoons were owned by kings and rich nobles, but not by the common people.

At about the time Columbus was born, brass and pewter spoons began to come into widespread use in Europe. The best spoons of the present

time are silver-plated or of solid silver. Plated spoons have iron or other strong metal as a base. This know that because they left stone base is covered with silver, and if the work is done well, the spoons may keep their silver plating for 20 or 30 years.
