





All the Muses were said to be daughter of the great god Zeus, who lived on Mount Olympus. The Romans called this god Jupiter, meaning "Zeus the Father." When a Greek artist made a pic-

ture of Calliope, he showed her holding a wax-covered tablet and a stylus. The stylus was an ancient form of the pencil, and was used to scratch words on the wax surface. Since Calliope dealt with poetry, it may seem strange that her name should be used for a musical instrument. Yet we must remember that music was mixed with poetry in the minds of people long ago. A poet often sang the words he had written, and at the
