Board to Study Railmen's Wages

Mr. Roosevelt instructed them "to reconsider the claims for wage adjustments... and to recommend to me such adjustments which should be made within the limits of the stabilization act and the wage stabilization program."
Mr. Roosevelt instructed the new board to give such consideration as it deems appropriate to recommendations filed Sept. 25 by an emergency board which considered wage demands of 350,000 higher paid operating railway workers.

Invasion First, Izvestia Warns

MOSCOW (U.P.)—The Soviet government publication Izvestia, in a new second front appeal on the eve of the tri-partite conference in Moscow, hinted strongly Saturday that agreement without firm assurance that Great Britain and the United States intend an early invasion of western Europe.
In an editorial entitled "On the Eve of the Moscow Conference," Izvestia expressed confidence that the three powers can reach full agreement on all their problems, but declared that all other questions are secondary to a quick victory over Germany—via the second front route.
"The solution of post-war problems can only be successful on condition that everything is done politically, militarily and economically, to bring about the speedy termination of the war," it said.
"The Allies' main task now is to knock the weapon of time from Hitler's hands and deal a crushing, decisive defeat," it said.
