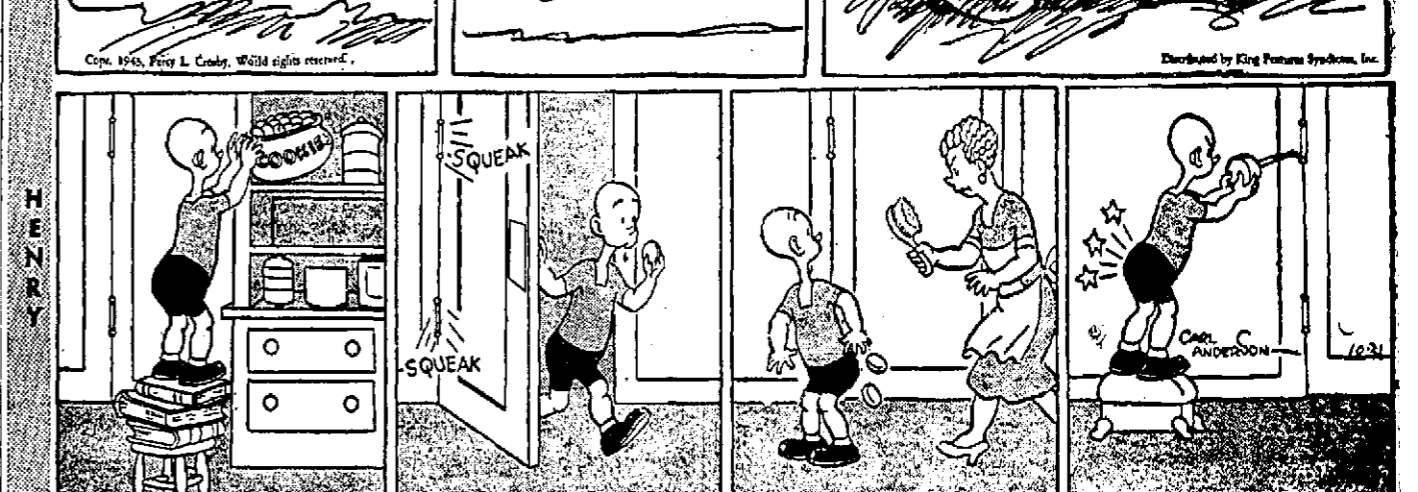

BOLL WEEVILS ARE VILLAINS IN STORY OF COTTON

A FIELD of cotton, ready for picking, has been compared to a mass of snowballs on green plants. When these "snowballs" are touched, however, they do not feel at all cold.

A warm climate is needed for good cotton growing. There must also be a long summer season. A month or two of hot weather is not enough for cotton

green object known as a "boll" is to be seen in the place of the flower. The boll adds to its size as the days and weeks go by. Inside it grow the seeds and the fibers known as cotton.

In from one and a half to two months, the boll gets to be so large that it bursts. This is a sign that the cotton is about ready for picking.

It would be very fine if the growth of a cotton plant could be just a sweet story from the planting of the seeds to the picking of the crop. As it is, there are villains in the story. Cotton has enemies, and they do great damage.

Among the lesser enemies are field mice and rats. They do enough harm to be called "cotton
