

Mother Love Is Theme Of Newest Feature At Quilna

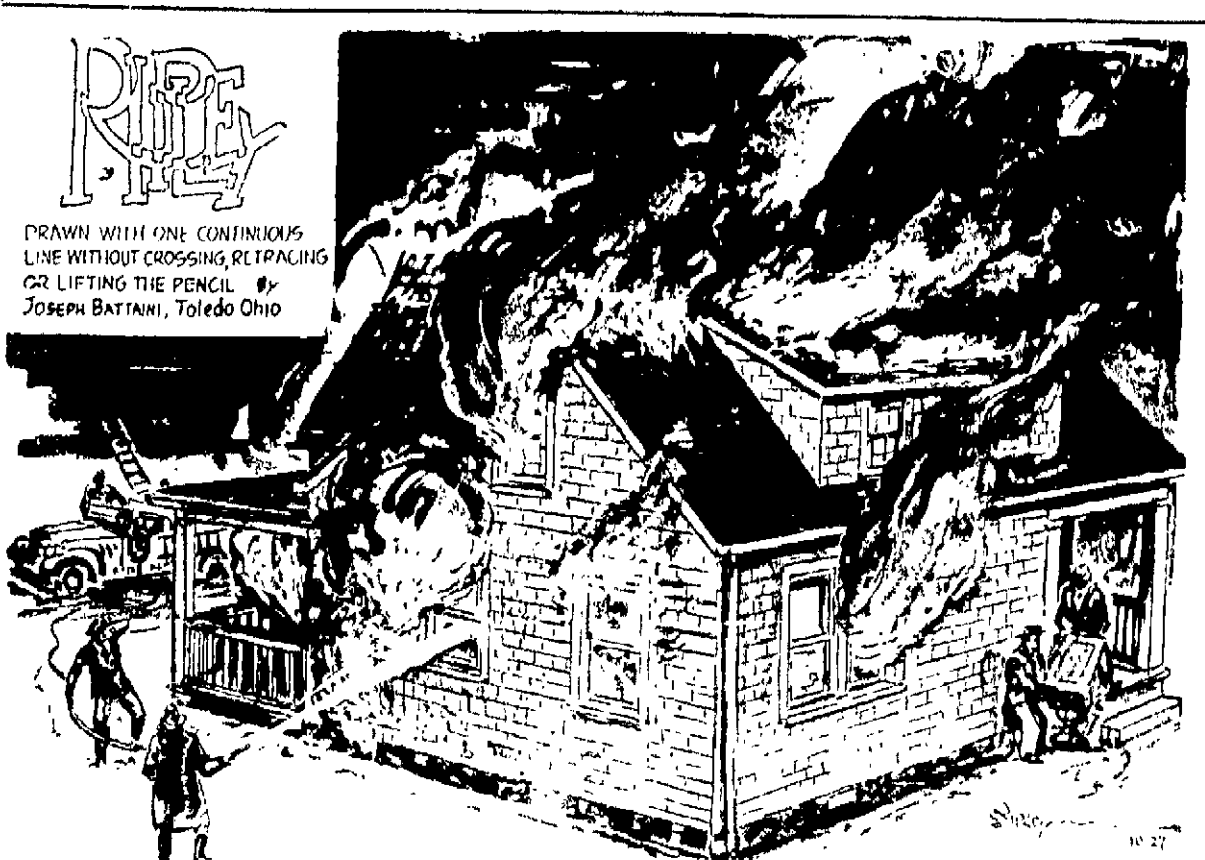

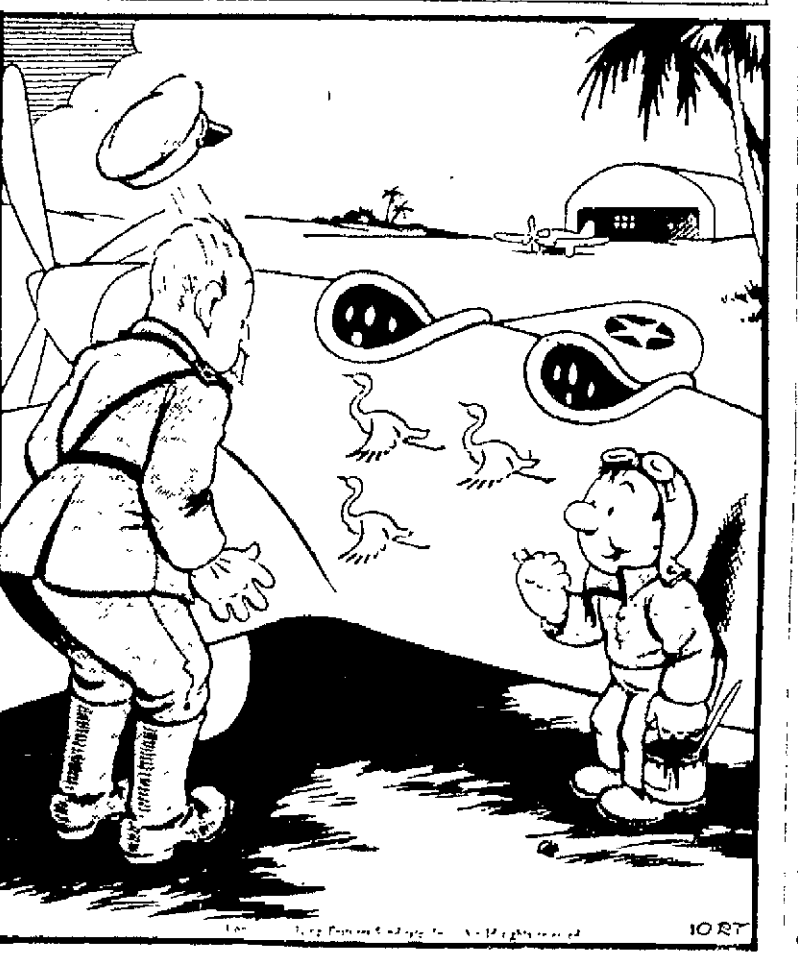
