TWIN-SLAYER TO FACE TRIAL; DENIES GUILT

Defeated by a jury at a sanity hearing in his first effort to be committed to the Lima State hospital in preference to facing trial for the murder of a set of Cleveland twins, 18-year-old William Hagerst will try again.

The confessed slayer was declared sane Wednesday at Cleveland, and he was arraigned immediately on a first degree murder indictment returned last month.

His attorneys entered a plea of not guilty by reason of insanity. In testimony at the sanity hearing, eight psychiatrists testified five contending Hagerst was sane and three that he was insane.

Hagerst had confessed he shot and killed James and Charles Collins last Aug. 12. The 13-year-old twins were found dead in a suburban Bay Village wooded section.

The trial jury, it was explained, can now find Hagerst innocent by reason of insanity, or it can find him guilty, recommending mercy or sending him to the electric chair. If he is found insane, he probably will be sent to the Lima institution.
