We are not told just how far they fell, but Selkirk was knocked senseless.

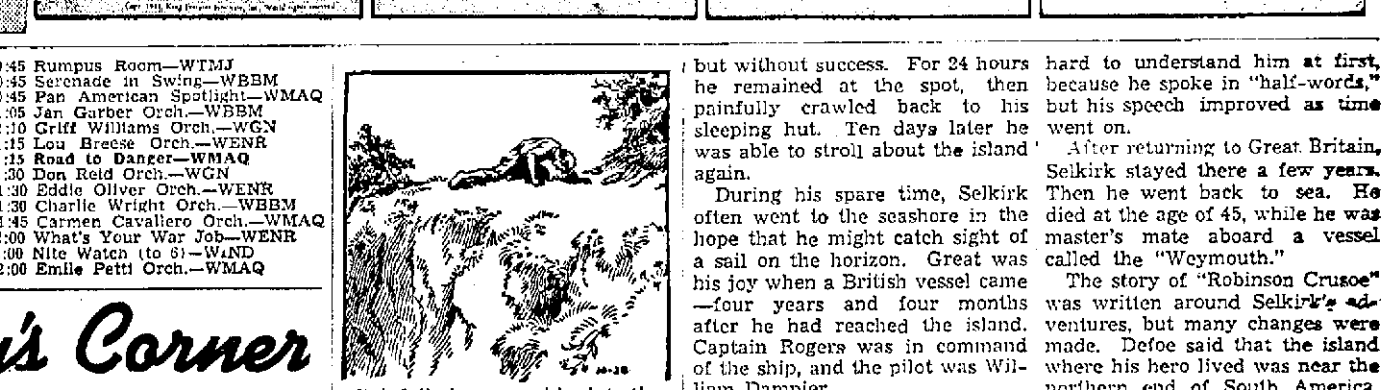
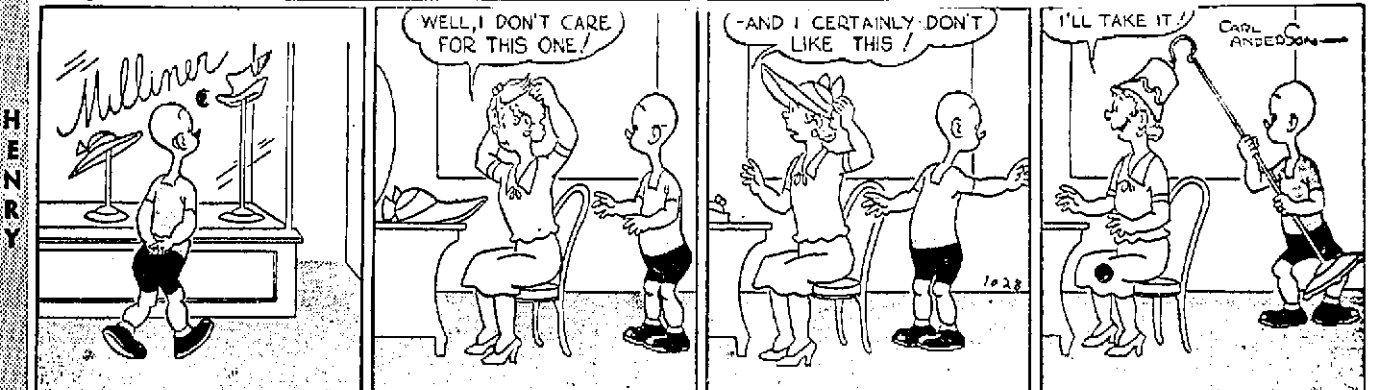
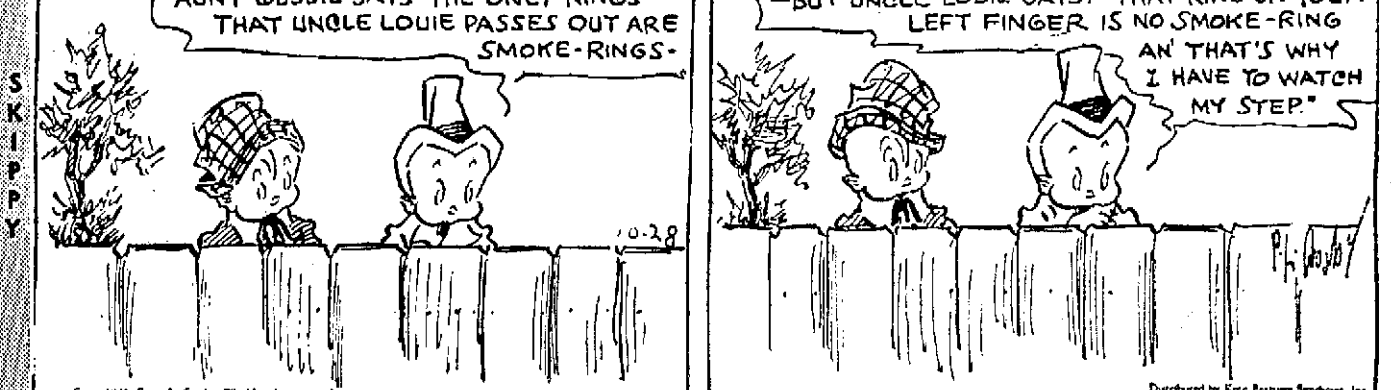
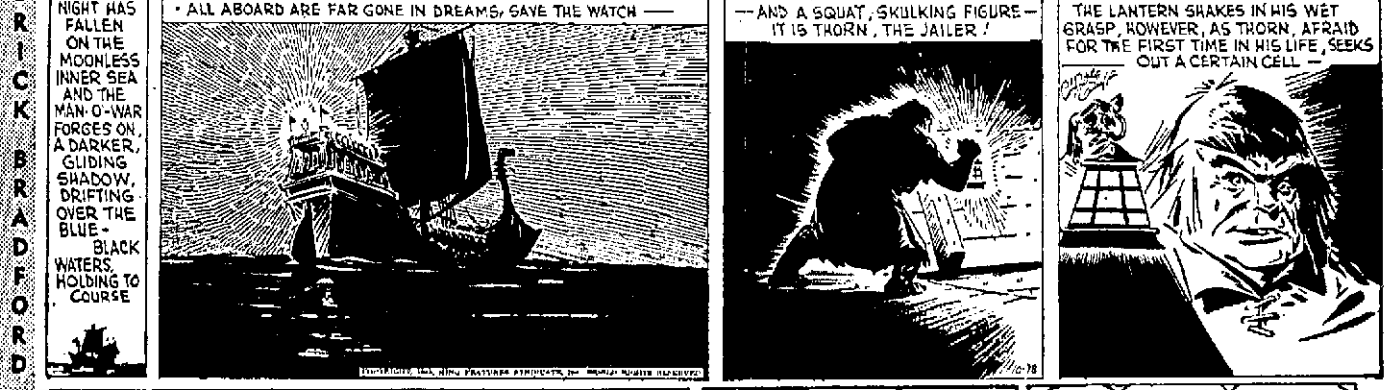
