

RURAL SALVAGE DRIVE TO OPEN HERE MONDAY

Pupils Will Collect Paper Thruout County Taking It To Schools

With Lima's paper salvage campaign having produced 30 tons up to Saturday morning, Charles H. Cook, county salvage chairman, announced that a similar county campaign will be started Monday.

As in the Lima campaign, school children in the county will make collections from residents and take the paper to their schools where it will be picked up by trucks Monday, Nov. 8.

Three carloads of paper collected in the Lima drive were shipped to the paper mills the past week-end. A clean-up collection is scheduled at the city's public and parochial schools Monday. Several more tons are expected to be added to the total.

County schools will compete for three prizes during their campaign. First prize will be a \$50 War Bond, second prize a \$25 War Bond and third prize \$10 in War Savings stamps. The winning schools will be determined on the basis of most paper produced per capita enrollment.

County school children have been urged to go to every house in their school district for newspapers, wrapping paper, magazines, and all other kinds of paper, and for rope and hurlap.

School children are requested to tie each bundle securely and take to their school during this week.

The county campaign has the endorsement of Willard Floyd, county school superintendent, and Msgr. James S. Elder, dean of Catholic churches in this area.

Superintendent Floyd predicted county schools will "go over the top" for the boys in uniform, and Msgr. Elder expressed confidence that Delphos St. Johns school will get its quota. Parochial schools have approved the paper salvage program to the limit, Msgr. Elder said.

Contrary to general opinion, Chairman Cook said, America is in greater need of waste paper today than ever before. According to the pulp division of the War Production Board, the paper industry is facing a serious situation. Owing to a shortage of manpower in the woods, it is unable to increase its supply of wood pulp. The resultant deficiency must be made up with waste paper.
