"Chetniks," depicting the outstanding work of the fighting guerrillas in hampering Axis operations in the Balkans, is being shown at the Lyric as a part of a double bill with "It's a Great Life." The latter film is based on the famous comic strip, "Blondie and Dagwood."

The Drive In theatre now is showing the interesting "Little Old New York," starring Alice Faye and Fred MacMurray.

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"Quilina" is the "happy ending" long a Hollywood institution, is on the way out! War practically killed it. With Pearl Harbor, the screen suddenly realized that it must do more than manufacture innocuous celluloid drama, in the face of grim reality, it could no longer go on just telling Grimm fairy tales.

And with that understanding, Hollywood came of age! This maturity is evident in several new films, particularly the highly dramatic "Appointment in Berlin," now playing at the Quilina theatre, in this exciting story of espionage. George Sanders and Marguerite Chapman, stars of the film, die tragic deaths at the conclusion.

They die, however, not because of frustrated love, but for a principle. George Sanders purposefully plummets his plane into an oil tank to light the sky for the R. A. F., and Marguerite Chapman, disavowing the Nazis, is killed by her own brother.

"Wake Island" was certainly not an "all-ends-well" picture and it was popular and successful. In the same class we have "Bataan," "The Moon is Down," and in "Keeper of the Flame," Katherine Hepburn dies at the conclusion of the story. A radical departure!

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"Lyric" Philip Dorn and Martin Kosleck are teamed for the second time in "Chetniks." The Fighting Guerrillas, the action thriller, at the Lyric theatre.

And this time, moviegoers will be happy to know, the show is on the other foot. In the first picture they made together, entitled "Underground," Dorn was tortured and eventually killed by Kosleck, portraying a Gestapo official. In their new film, Kosleck's position is unchanged, but Dorn's is.

The latter appears as the resourceful leader of the Balkan irregulars exacting their toll from the invader. Kosleck still has the edge in numbers and equipment, but he finds himself unable to cope with the daring patriots fighting for the women and freedom they love.

BREWSTER HITS DELAYS ON AIR BASE PROBLEM

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1—(AP)—Convinced that the United States should exert aerial might in peace as well as in war, Senator Brewster (R-Me) advised today that "aeronautics must inevitably be an instrument of national policy."

Reporting to the Truman committee on the recent inspection tour with four other senators to world battlefronts, Brewster added:

"If America is to maintain an interest in the affairs of the world, America must be able in the field of communications and transportation to sit at least as equal at the table of the nations."

"Every day of delay in approaching this problem increases the hazards that American interests will suffer in the years that are to come."

NUTMEATS PUT UNDER CEILINGS

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1—(AP)—Price control was extended over nutmeats for the first time today with announcement by the Office of Price Administration of ceilings which it said should save consumers at least 10 cents a pound.

The most important of the varieties affected by the order are walnuts, almonds, filberts, and pecans. Peanuts already are under price control.

MANNING TABLE WORK REDUCED

CLEVELAND, Nov. 1—(AP)—The Regional War Manpower Commission today reduced clerical work involved in employers' preparation of manning tables.

Employers in Ohio, Michigan and Kentucky hereafter need not fill out part three of the manning table, Regional Director Robert C. Goedwin announced, since this is "identical to part one sent to us by state selective service headquarters."

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
