

Bob Hope's New Fun Film Coming To Ohio On Friday

Reportedly the biggest Bob Hope laugh of them all, "Let's Face It" comes to the Ohio theatre as a feature billing, starting Friday. On Wednesday and Thursday the house was reserved for a private showing for the Lima Tank Depot.

The super-spy picture, "Appointment in Berlin," and the comedy-mystery, "Dangerous Blondes," now are showing at the Quilna with a double bill of "Week-End in Havana" and "Paris after Dark," scheduled to start with a preuve Friday.

"Guns of the Peaco," a thrilling Western, and "The Strange Death of Adolf Hitler," currently are showing at the Sigma theatre.

"Alaska Highway," a film based on the famous Army road built from Canada to Alaska, and "Bombardier," featuring the U.S. air forces, opened Thursday at the State theatre.

At the Lyric, "Wagon Train West," and "Here Comes Kelly," started Thursday with "Hi-Yo" and "Cipher Bureau" billed for a midnight show Saturday.

Drive In theatre, now operating for its last week this season, has as its feature show, "Young and Willing," starring William Holden and Susan Hayward. On Friday will come "Hudson's Bay" in which Paul Muni does a great bit of work.

The Majestic has for its attraction starting Thursday, a double bill of "Leopard Man" and "Moon and a Sixpence," the latter based on the famed book by Somerset Maugham.

STATE

A thrilling action movie based on the heroic job of building the Alaska highway, the Alaskan Canadian road which was so vital to the protection of our northernmost outposts against the Japs, opened at the State theatre Thursday. It is "Alaska Highway," starring Richard Arlen and Jean Parker with Ralph Sanford, Bill Henry, Joe Sawyer and Eddie Quillan.

The picture has all the earmarks of being a fast-paced thriller with its story of two brothers fighting the elements, and each other, pitched against the hazardous undertaking. Richard Arlen and Bill Henry play the brothers; Jean Arthur is the cause of their fighting. Both men are engineers. Their father (played by Harry Shannon) is placed in charge of the construction job as an army major. Jean goes to Alaska with the crew, accompanying her own engineer father.

Landslides, forest fires and other disasters conspire to keep the men from concluding the job on time, and all of it is reported to make very exciting seeing. So mark "Alaska Highway" down on your movie list of desirables. *

QUILNA

A private exhibit of recent Nazi poster art, photographed and smuggled out of occupied Europe by a newspaperman, was used to decorate a replica of the Berlin Anhalter railroad station in "Appointment in Berlin," starring George Sanders and Marguerite Chapman, and now playing at the Quilna theatre. The posters are an obvious attempt to give the flagging German spirits a shot in the arm, but seem to prove that all is not well on the German home front.

The virulent art is the work of Ludwig Rohlwing, leading Nazi poster artist. Executed in grim, stark simplicity, the posters reflect the facets of weakening civilian morale.

There is the strident "shame" poster which depicts a stoic helmeted soldier. Underneath are the terse words "And You?"

Then there is the "Gefahr!" poster which shrieks "Danger! Air Raid!" and shows a young mother frantically clutching her child to her bosom.

A startling commentary on informal conditions which Herr Goebbels does not voice abroad is the "Public Health" poster. Thematically it warns "Beware of Beggars." A touch of irony concludes the collection being used in the film. It is an old travel poster and reads:

"Visit Holland in the Spring!"

Also playing is "Dangerous Blonder."
