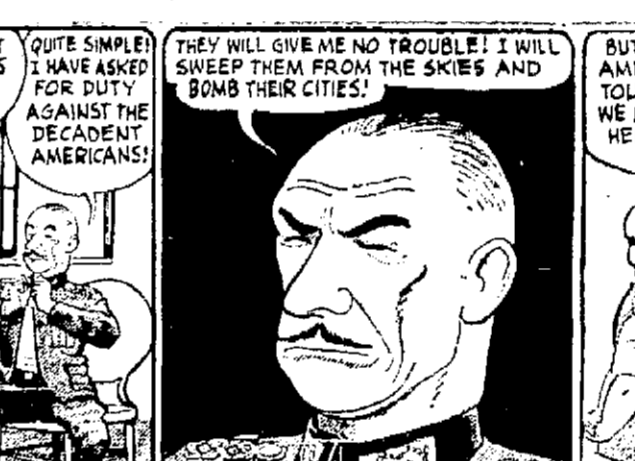

COLUMBUS, O., Nov. 9.—(INS)—A little of the "spirit of the old west" remained in the veins of Columbus police today after they were called upon to stage a round-up yesterday.

A cow, apparently strayed from a local packing house, created a sensation when it appeared at Camden and St. Clair-aves. The critter was captured some blocks away by Patrolman Lloyd Vest with the aid of bystanders.

STRIKE THREAT CLEARED

COLUMBUS, O., Nov. 9.—(AP)—A five-cents-an-hour wage increase voted by city council to street cleaning employees brought an end of a three-day strike by the 47 workers. The new rates are 74¢ and 75¢ cents an hour, depending on the type of work.

CANTON, O., Nov. 9.—(AP)—Carl E. Bergmeyer, 34, scheduled to be arraigned today on a murder charge in the holdup slaying of Tony Nastro, 62, died yesterday after taking an overdose of a sedative, his physician, Dr. L. A. Stoner, reported. Matthew Piccolantonio, 23, was accused with Bergmeyer.

 WAPAKONETA, Nov. 9.—Auglaize-co Sheriff William Nietzer today warned persons practicing shooting to refrain from doing so when it endangered lives and property of others. The warning was the result of a complaint received in his office.

Lon Miller of four miles northeast of here, reported that he was forced to make repairs to a combine used in harvesting a soy bean crop Saturday. He told authorities that two bullets, believed to have been fired from a 22-calibre rifle, broke some gears on his combine while at work in a field near the Auglaize river. Sheriff Nietzer said that future violators would be prosecuted.
