



In 1918 Woodrow Wilson wanted to make a dream of a lasting world peace become a real thing. He did not invent the idea of a League of Nations, but he did most to bring it about. Wilson's last years were saddened by the fact that the United States Senate failed to accept the treaty he had signed to join the League. More than half the sena-tors voted in favor of the treaty, but not enough for a two-thirds majority. Before his death, Wilson said there was likely to be a new World war in about 20 years, since the United States was not in the
