Later reports, after Naples was taken, said that the city had been damaged in parts but was far from being destroyed. The beautiful blue bay is still there, as it has been through thousands of years.

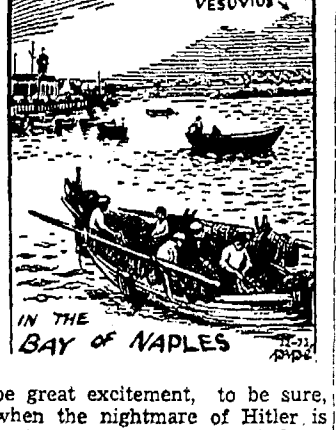
