Rolling comedy is mixed with the tense action and cowboy music is supplied by Cliff Edwards

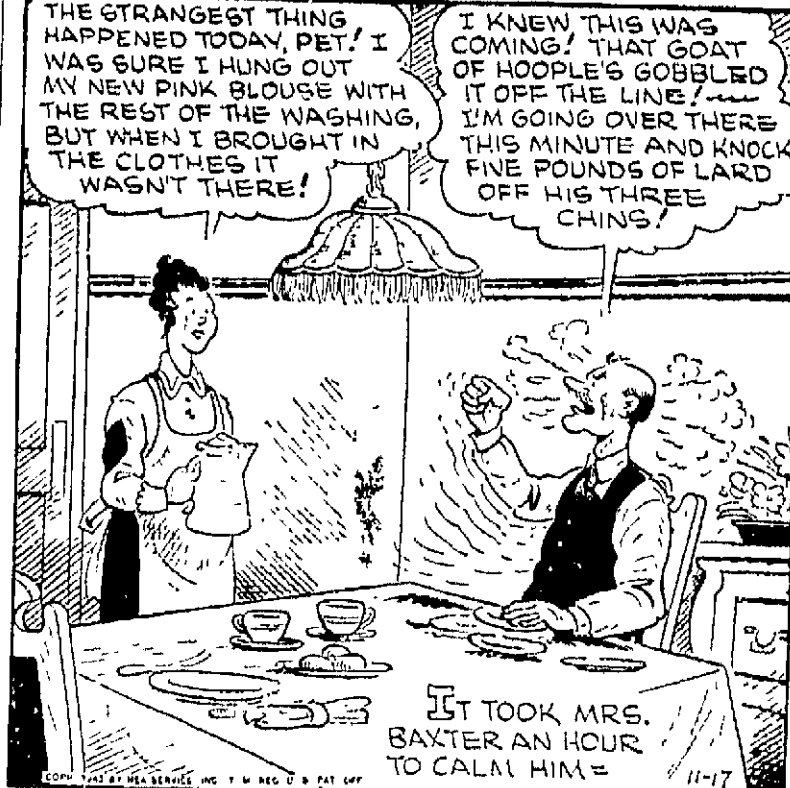
QUILNA

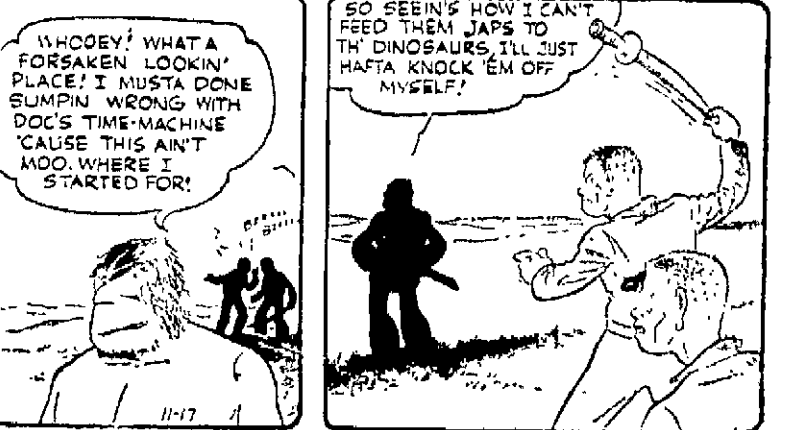

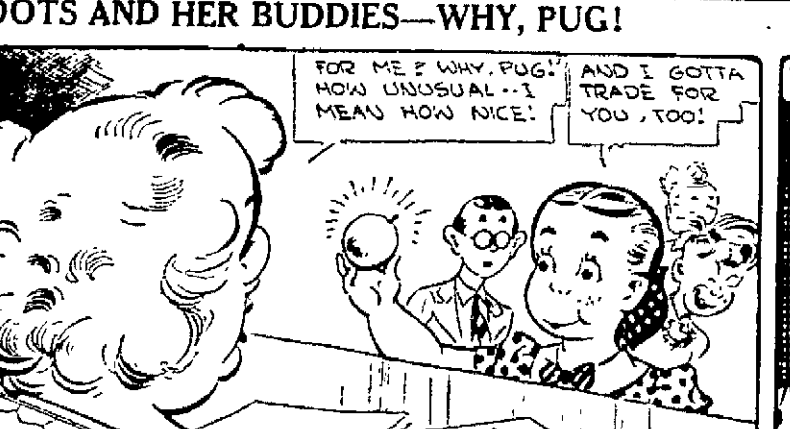

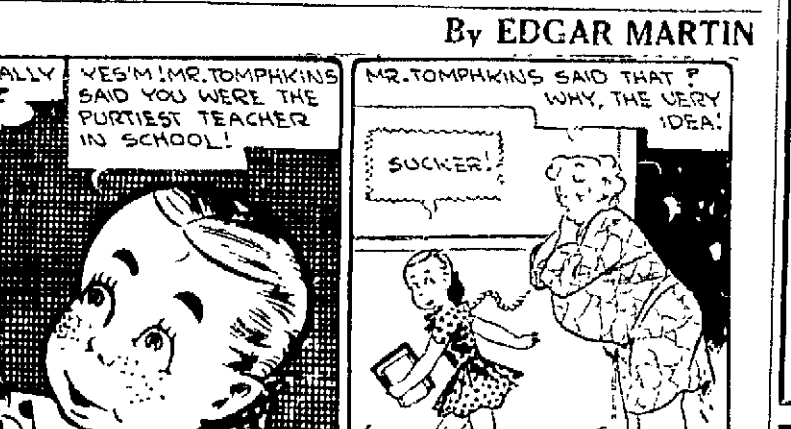

3 BILLION AID GIVEN RUSSIA

WASHINGTON, Nov. 17—(UP)—Foreign Economic Administrator Leo T. Crowley today disclosed that lend-lease shipments to Russia to the end of September, 1943, amounted to \$3,287,047,000 and included 6,500 airplanes. Of the total assistance given to the U. S. S. R. by the United States, Crowley revealed, \$1,850,466,000 was in military items, \$884,369,000 in industrial materials,

HARBOR FUND APPROVED WASHINGTON, Nov. 17—(AP)

The house rivers and harbors committee approved a \$365,000,000 navigation and power authorization program, much of it intended for execution in the post-war period. Among the Ohio harbor projects approved were Lorain, \$30,000; Cleveland, \$166,000; and Detroit and Ann Arbor, Mich., \$38,000. The program will be presented to congress early in 1944.
