Uncle Ray's Corner

Comets Carry Little Danger for People on Earth

IN CENTURIES gone by, it was common for people to see a meaning in any large comet which appeared in the sky. They feared that it meant a war or plague or some other unhappy event.

It so happened that a large comet appeared in 1066, the year that the Normans invaded England, but this comet (now known as Halley's) has been seen many other times and usually with no special ill fortune following. If we need a big comet for a war to start, why were none seen in 1914 or 1939, when the first and second World wars opened?

A long time has passed — 33 years — since a first-rate comet has appeared in the sky. Astronomers have seen many little ones in that time, but none to class with Hal-

see them two or three months before they come into sight, but seldom can tell about them years in advance. An exception to the rule is the beautiful Halley's comet, which has an average period of 76 years and two months.

If we are going to be treated anything like as well as the people of the nineteenth century, there ought to be another big comet within the next few years. To find out whether that will happen, we shall just have to wait and see!

Most of the worry about comets has had little, or no, sense in it, but there is a question which may well be asked, "What would happen if a comet struck the earth?"

Astronomers say that even the largest known comet has less than one-millionth part of the weight, or mass, of the earth. Thus a collision would not wreck the earth.

Of course there might be important damage if the head of a comet struck a city such as New York. The core of a large comet's head has a good deal of solid material in it.

It is almost certain that a few comets have struck the earth in times past. Meteor Crater in Arizona was made either by a small comet or by a gigantic meteor or swarm of meteors. This crater is a hole 570 feet deep and four-fifths of a mile wide.
