## BRICKER RECORD IS CONDEMNED BY CIO COUNCIL

COLUMBUS, O., Nov. 25—(AP)—The Ohio Congress of Industrial Organizations council today was on record condemning the "actions and policies" of Gov. John W. Bricker.

Eight hundred delegates to the sixth annual convention in a last-minute action approved a resolution to "support President Roosevelt in his fight against Fascism, Nazism and in his battle against appeasement in America."

Asserting the governor had "joined hands" with forces "undermining the President and the war policies of the organized labor movement, thereby spreading disunity and confusion on the home front," the resolution continued: "Be it resolved that the CIO council go on record as condemning the actions and policies of Governor Bricker."

Ohio's old age pension system also was assailed before the convention adjourned.

**EMPLOYEES OF NEW IDEA FIRM TO RESUME WORK**

(Special To The Lima News) COLUMBIA, Nov. 25—A group of employees of New Idea, Inc., here, who struck last Thursday, will return to work at the plant here under orders of the regional War Labor Board, it was announced Thursday by L. K. Houghman, representative of the International Upholsterers Union, AFL.

The unanimous decision of the War Labor Board was sent by telegram signed by Frederick H. Bullen, director of disputes.

The strike which started last Thursday afternoon was reported to have been in sympathy with 10 employees who were discharged following a disagreement over piece work rates.

## 75,000 DUTCH PROSECUTED FOR FOOD VIOLATION

LONDON, Nov. 25.—(INS)—German-occupation-authorities in Holland have announced 75,000 prosecutions and confiscation of some 4,000,000 pounds of food and 1,500 head of livestock in the first half of 1943, in a drive against violators of food control regulations, it was reported today.

The figures were broadcast by the German-controlled Hilversum radio in a summary of a report of the central control service for food supply.

The confiscations were said to include 1,050,400 pounds of wheat and seeds, 730,400 pounds of potatoes, 2,200,000 pounds of vegetables and fruit, 79,200 pounds of meat and bacon, 269 head of cattle, 666 pigs, 554 sheep and 84 horses.

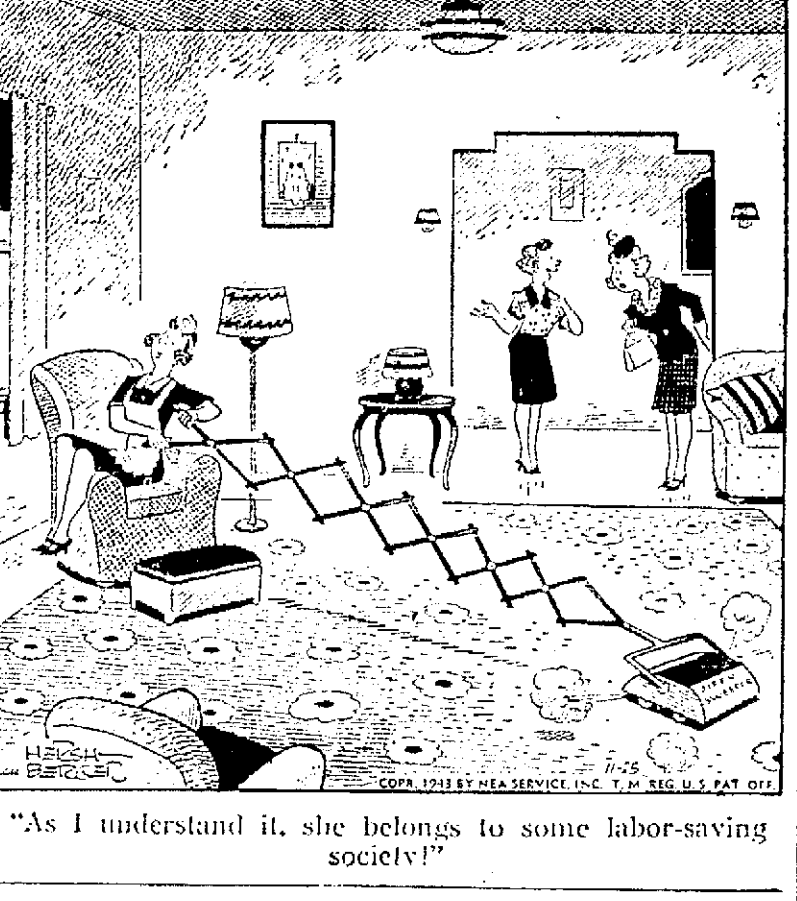
