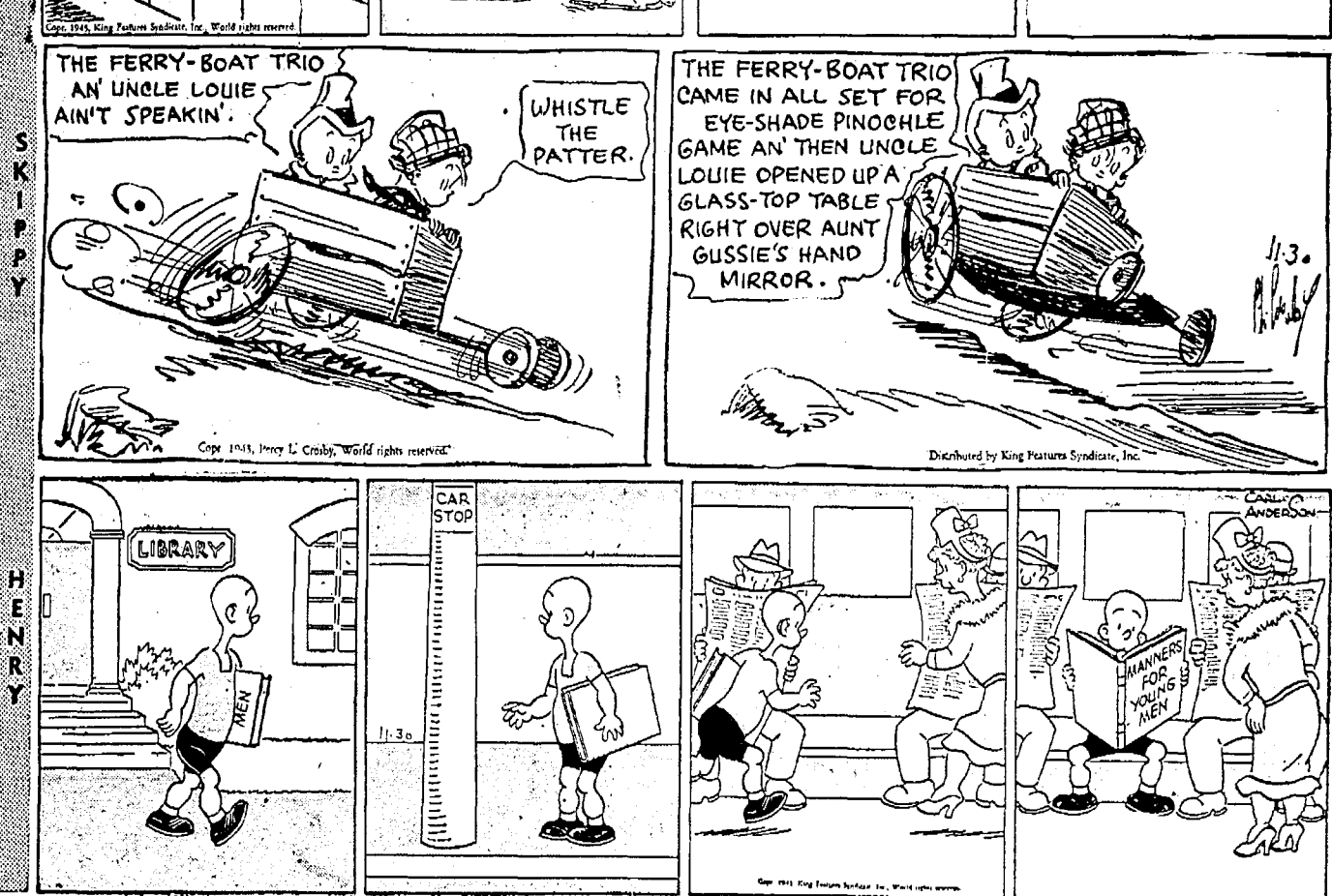
#### RAVENS SOMETIMES REACH RIFE OLD AGE
