

Action Of Plot Showing At Lyric Is In Exclusive School

OHIO The bell that tolls in the Technicolor film version of "For Whom the Bell Tolls" is California's oldest mission bell, cast in bronze by Manuel Vargas in Lima, Peru, in 1818 for La Purisima Mission at Lompoc.

The bell was borrowed from the mission fathers and transported 140 miles to Hollywood. A special yoke, from which the bell was suspended, provided safety in transportation, and also the requisite setting for its filming in the picture.

Cracked slightly on two sides, the bell, weighing 285 pounds, carries the inscription: "Manuel Vargas me fecit, Lima, Peru, anno domini 1818. Mission de la Purisima de la Nueva California."

The bell appears in the opening and end titles of the film and its tones are heard "as if tolling for all suffering humanity" when Gary Cooper, as Robert Jordan, faces death from the oncoming Fascist cavalry. Mortally wounded, he covers the escape of Maria, played by Ingrid Bergman, and the remnant of Pablo's guerrilla band as theounding of the machine gun fades into the tolling of the great bell.

LYRIC "Beyond the Last Frontier" is the first of the new series of pictures introducing the cowboy personality of Eddie Dew to the public. The picture is being presented at the Lyric theatre, and by all accounts it will live up to the finest traditions of western epics.

Prominent in the cast will be Jack Kirk, whose face is so familiar to all western fans. In this picture he does a particularly good job, and his big reputation will be considerably enhanced. He is acknowledged to be one of the best "heavyies" in the business.

Sharing honors with Dew is Smiley Burnette, with his unusual brand of humor, and also in the cast are Ernie Adams, Kermit Maynard and Lorraine Miller.

"Nobody's Darling" is the co-feature of the program.

Screen actor Richard Lane is winning new popularity with his colorful characterization in "Corvette K-225," the Canadian naval film produced by Howard Hawks and now showing at the Sigma theatre.
