




F YOU took a trip through the islands of the Azores group, there is a strange sight which you might see a number of times. I am thinking of the windmills.

These windmills have huge wheels with pieces of canvas on them instead of wood or metal slats. Often the wheel is more than 25 feet wide. Its axle is set near the top of a tower, only about 15 feet high, and the wheel almost touches the ground.

When the wind starts to blow well, the owner of a windmill blows a loud blast on a horn as a signal to farmers in the region. The ound means that the miller is ready to grind corn and wheat.

When Portuguese settlers came to the Azores, they found the trees

too small. Not much was done about this at first, but a century ago the seeds and cuttings of various trees were brought in. Today the people have tall elms, chestnuts and oaks, along with tulip trees and date palms. The smallest of the nine islands is Corvo. It has an area of only seven square miles, and a popula-

tion of about 700. On this island the people raise a special breed of cattle. Even when full grown, these cattle are of small size, but they give creamy milk.

Since there is no dentist on Corvo, the people have to go to the island of Flores, 12 miles distant, to have their teeth treated. When they suffer from toothache, the sea trip must seem very slow to them. (For TRAVEL section of your scrapbook.)
