NATION-WIDE RATIONING OF LIQUOR URGED

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13—(AP)—Nation-wide rationing of liquor from distiller to consumer was proposed today by Senator Kilgore (D-W.Va.) as a possible solution to the current whisky shortage.

Kilgore, who is a member of a judiciary subcommittee investigating the drought which has shriveled retailers' stocks of potables, told a reporter he believed the government ought to tighten its control over supplies by substituting national rationing for hazardous quota sales instituted voluntarily in many places and applied by some states.

In the past the Office of Price Administration has steered away from liquor rationing on the grounds that its machinery was not to deal only with necessities and it did not place liquor in any such category.
