Mismanagement Blamed for Tarawa Losses

WASHINGTON (U.P.)—Andrew J. Higgins, whose landing craft have borne American fighting men in every invasion of the war, declared today that bad handling of his boats was responsible for heavy marine casualties during the attack on "bloody Tarawa."
 Higgins told the United Press that there had been criticism of Higgins' boat performance by "some uninformed officers and a national news magazine," and asserted:
 "The boats could do the job. They just weren't handled right. They've got to be driven by someone who will bang them into the shore at full speed, not coddle them like an admiral's launch."

Conservation Group to Buy 2,667 Acres

In a move to augment Wisconsin park property, the state conservation commission today authorized purchase of 2,667 acres of land at a cost of \$2,833,700.
 The largest allocation was made for Peninsula state park, Door county, where the commission is attempting to incorporate into the park all private property within its boundaries. The commission directed the conservation department to purchase 157 acres of privately-owned land for \$18,000.
 It also approved purchase of 2,480 acres for Flambeau River park at a cost of \$3,833 and 40 acres for Devil's Lake park at a cost of \$700.
 Income from hunting and fishing licenses, which goes into the state conservation fund, will finance the purchases.

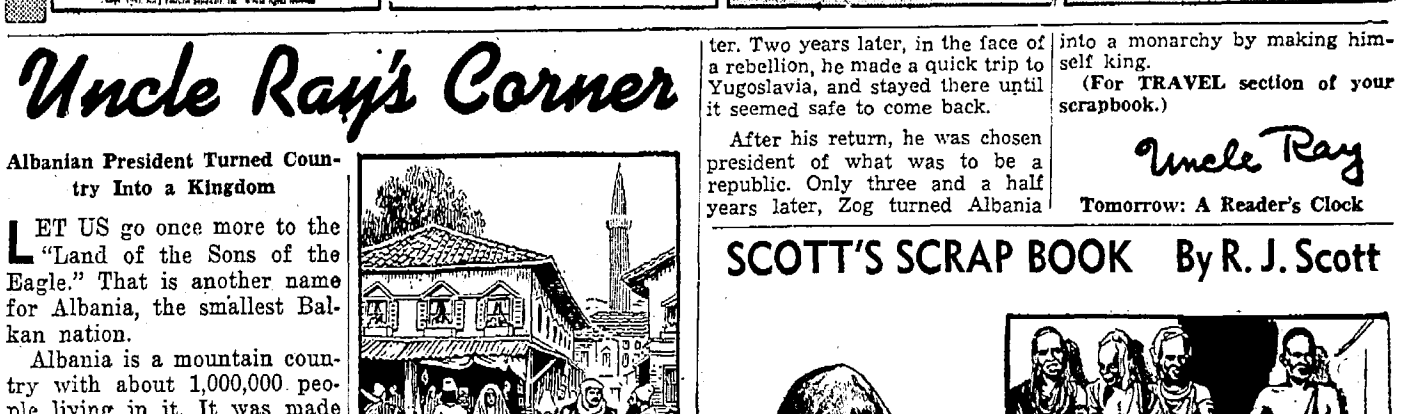
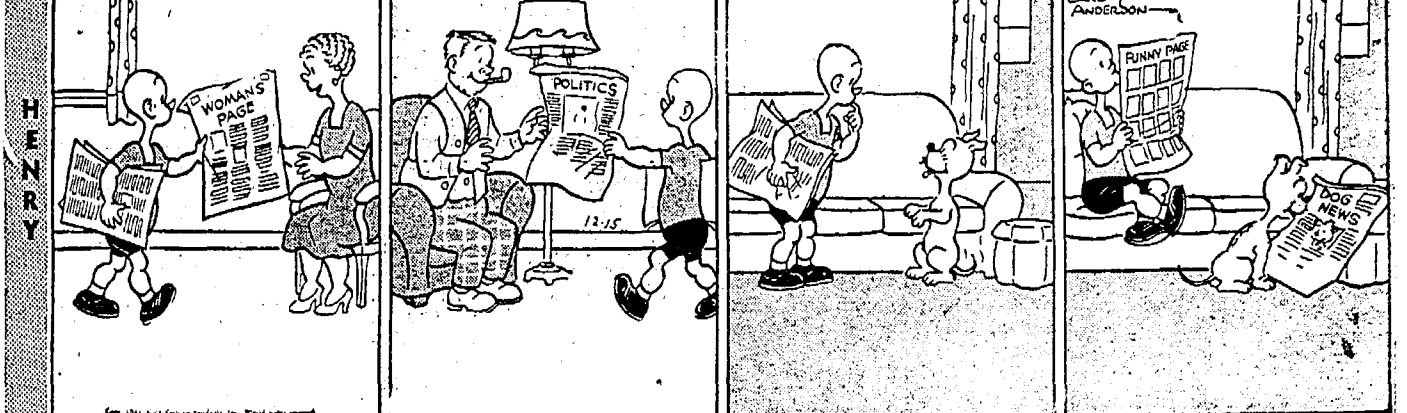
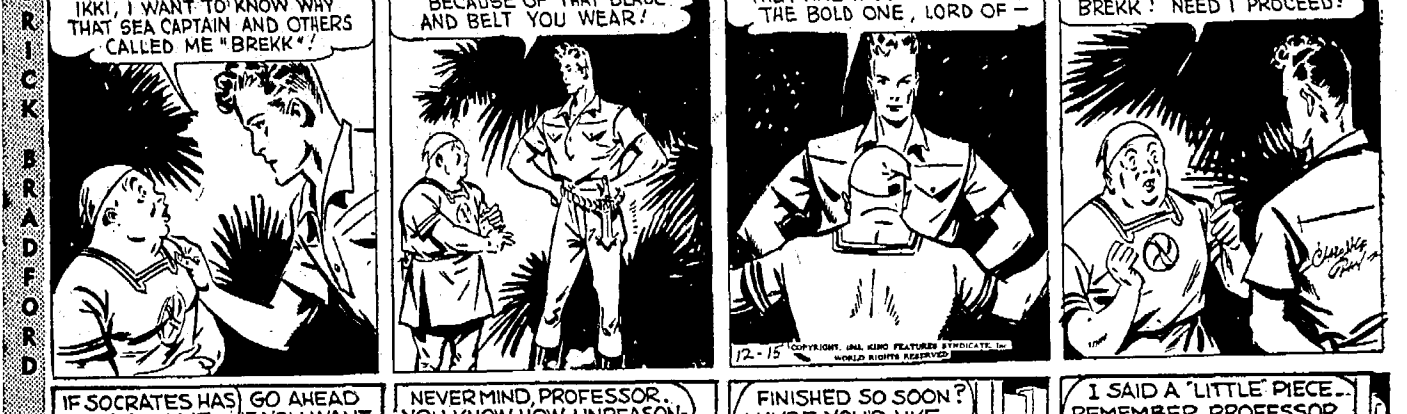

Albanian President Turned Country Into a Kingdom

LET US go once more to the "Land of the Sons of the Eagle." That is another name for Albania, the smallest Balkan nation.

Albania is a mountain country with about 1,000,000 people living in it. It was made "free" only 30 years ago, but it has had a stormy history in the time since then.

If you made a visit to Albania, you would find it a problem to get transport from one town to another. When the present war broke out, not a single railroad line was running in the whole country. The people commonly travel on roads or mountain trails.

So far as Albania has good roads, most of the credit must be given to Italy. Italian companies supplied money and labor for fixing the roads before Mussolini invaded the country and took it over.

A king named Zog left Albania in a hurry when Italian troops moved in during the spring of 1939.

Zog the First (and perhaps the Last) is the only Albanian king who has held real power since the country was made free in 1913. For a six-month period in 1913, a king of a sort was placed in charge

ter. Two years later, in the face of a rebellion, he made a quick trip to Yugoslavia, and stayed there until it seemed safe to come back.

After his return, he was chosen president of what was to be a republic. Only three and a half years later, Zog turned Albania into a monarchy by making himself king.
