WLB REJECTS IDEA OF FLAT WAGE BOOSTS

NEW YORK, Dec. 16—(INS)—WLB Chairman William H. Davis flatly rejected today the idea that the board would grant blanket wage increases to workers of the nation.

With every major labor union in the country demanding a revision upward of existing wage scales, Davis expressed his unalterable opposition to such increases except for longer hours of work.

The next 90 days are the crucial period in the battle against inflation, Davis declared, and the fight will be won if congress refuses to be budged by pressure groups demanding higher wages or prices for special interests.
