FIRE DAMAGE SET AT \$7,000

Ottawa Warehouse Badly Burned Late Thursday

OTTAWA, Dec. 17 — Workmen Friday began cleaning up the ruined interior of the John Schaefer and Son warehouse on E. Fourth-st at the Baltimore and Ohio railroad after fire caused between \$5,000 and \$7,000 damage at the establishment at 5:30 p. m. Thursday.

The blaze was discovered when the Frank Cox family looked out of a window in their home immediately east of the warehouse and saw flames shooting out of the windows. The Ottawa Fire department was summoned and poured water on the fire for two hours before it finally was extinguished.

Schaefer operates a wholesale produce business from the warehouse. He said that the normal stock in the warehouse amounts to about \$10,000 and estimated that about half of the contents were ruined or burned.

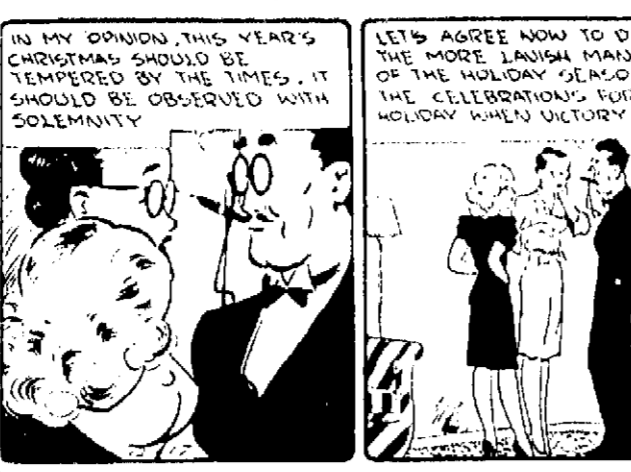
The warehouse contained large quantities of sugar, flour and potatoes as well as oranges, apples, nuts and other perishable items. Most of this stock was ruined that was stored in the front portion of the warehouse.

Chief C. J. Doepker of the fire department said that an overheated furnace probably started the blaze. He said a workman had fixed the fire shortly before the flames were discovered. No one was in the building, however, when the fire was discovered.

Schaefer said that his loss will be covered by insurance and the warehouse will be repaired as quickly as possible so it can be restocked.

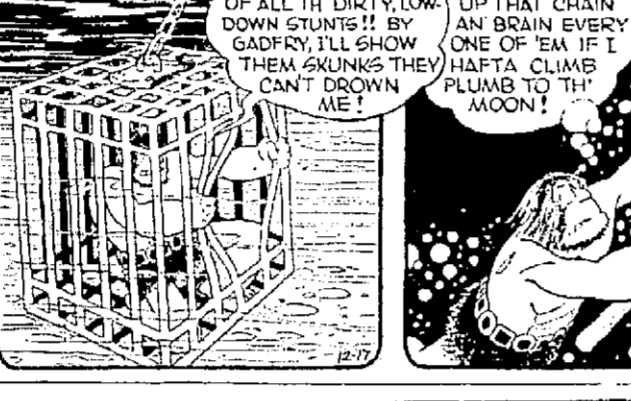

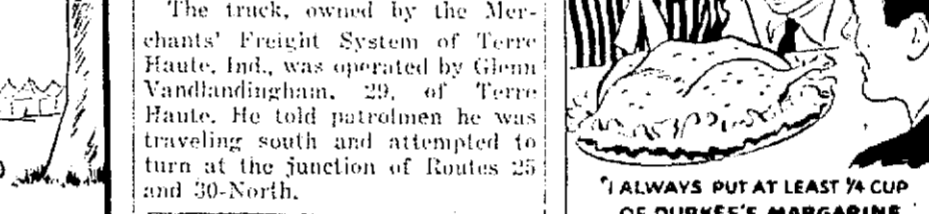

8,000 BUSHELS OF POTATOES LOST IN ADA BLAZE

ADA, Dec. 17—Flames, starting when a tractor backfired and exploded Thursday, destroyed a large double-walled potato storage on the Besse Brothers farm, five miles east of Ada in Route-51. The 50 by 100 feet farm building with a capacity of 60,000 bushels of potatoes, was reported to have contained about 8,000 bushels.

The fire leaped high from the building, burning the telegraph and telephone wires where they passed over the structure near the Pennsylvania railroad. Wire service was disrupted for three hours and the railroads signal system was reported out of commission for a like period.

Intending to pick corn, the Bosses were starting the tractor to attach it to a picker, when the explosion occurred. The tractor, picker, a rubber-tired wagon, a potato loader and a potato grader burned along with the building and contents.

No one was injured in the explosion. The Ada and Dandkirk fire departments were called, but firemen were handicapped by a scarcity of water.

It is reported that the farm, on the edge of the Hog Creek marsh, was recently purchased by J. M. Stambaugh, of Ada, who is to get possession of the land on Jan. 1.
