FIRE DESTROYS SUPER MARKET

COLUMBUS, O., Dec. 20 (INS) — Firemen today investigated a \$100,000 four-alarm fire that swept thru Albers Super Market, in suburban Bexley, early Sunday.

The blaze, originating in the rear of the building, was discovered by patrons of a nearby lunchroom reported hearing a muffled explosion, Bexley police said.

When firemen first arrived, flames were shooting out of the roof at the rear and had spread throughout the interior of the one-story structure. Shortly after the arrival of fire apparatus a second explosion blew out the large plate glass windows in front of the store, firemen reported.

Fire Chief Clarence Ogborn, after a preliminary investigation, said the fire started near the furnace. He said the second explosion which broke the windows probably resulted from hot gases in a confined area. No one was injured.
